TSA Goal and Authorities

TSA Goal: Enable willing international partners to address shared security interests while developing their own capability to meet and exceed international aviation security standards.

Authorities

FAA Reauthorization Safety and Security Act of 2016

TSA may conduct Training and Assistance globally

Presidential Policy Directive (PPD) – 23, April 5, 2013

US Government-wide program to coordinate and de-conflict assistance





TSA Implementation in Africa

Strategy and Priorities

Work towards the **measurable** and **sustainable** reduction in global aviation security risk by:

- ➤ Sharing expertise, lessons learned, and best practices
- ➤ Enabling partners to resolve identified deficiencies
- ➤ Promoting enhanced culture of aviation security

Strategic Partnership:

>US Department of State

- Focus on access control and insider risk;
- 2. Develop AVSEC partners to become regional leaders in aviation security;
- 3. Promote the use of effective countermeasures to mitigate the low/non-metallic improvised explosive device (NMIED) threat

- Partner with a US based airport of similar size, enplanements, and program needs
- Host delegations in the US and reciprocal delegations in the partner country
- Exchange best practices, demonstrate programs, form relationships, learn from mutual experiences

Optimize Checkpoints

- Customized recommendations for advanced screening technology to best suit the needs of partner
- Installation and technical integration support
- Staff training and procedure development support

Ensure Sustainability

- Technicians attend Original Equipment Manufacturer Training (OEM) and receive certification to maintain equipment
- Builds capability to maintain equipment with less reliance on non-local manufacturers
- Promote as subject matter experts on the equipment locally and regionally
