#### INTRODUCTION 1

Objectives

This paper contains planned activities, projects and estimated budget for 1.1 implementation of the AFI SECFAL Plan activities and projects from January to December 2025

The development of the priority projects was guided by identified needs and expected results to be achieved by the AFI SECFAL Plan, for the extended period (2024-2030). The activities and deliverables for 2025 attached to this Working Paper as Attachment A, were extracted from Appendix B of the revised Plan Maser document, 2024-2030.

#### 2. DISCUSSION

- 2.1 The SC had earlier before, approved prioritized approach for support of states in four clusters, namely States with Significant Security Concerns (SSeCs, States with Effective Implementation of the Critical Elements of State Oversight System (EI) below 40%, EI above 50% but below 65% and fourthly, States with EI above 65%.
- 2.2 Consequently, selection of individual states and specific activities outlined in **Appendix A**, used the criteria approved by the Steering Committee, to prioritize support to states based on criticality of individual state needs. Other factors considered include the USAP-CMA audit results and needs assessment and analysis undertaken by the Plan Secretariat. Also considered in the selection of specific activities is provision of support to States eligible for USAP-CMA activity by ICAO and tailored support

to achieve the goals for implementation of the aspirational Windhoek targets as aligned with the Global Aviation Security Plan (GASeP).

- 2.3 In this proposal, priority is also given to assist and support efforts of States to timely implement their USAP-CMA Corrective Action Plans and prevention and resolution of Significant Security Concerns (SSeCs) through development of State specific projects. To leverage synergies, the Plan will focus on), enhancement of security culture, capacity building and enhancement of the existing coordination and collaboration mechanism amongst Plan partners and stakeholders at the national and regional level.
- 2.4 Other areas of focus include assisting the State efforts to strengthen border controls in fulfillment of the commitments set out in UNSCR 2309 (2016) and relevant ICAO Assembly Resolutions.
