IOM at a glance



- The UN Migration Agency, 173 Member States including all African States!
- Focus on policy and concrete project/programme implementation
- Solid capacity to implement large-scale technical assistance projects around the world
- Scale of total IOM programming: approx. 2'300 projects with total operational expenditure USD 1'8 billion per year
- Worldwide presence: offices in over 150 States and 393 field locations.
- IOM's immigration & border management (IBM) portfolio in 2018: total expenditure USD 124 million, 250 projects
- Demonstrated ability to deliver results also in challenging environments!
- 10 years of IOM's African Capacity Building Center on Migration and Border Management (ACBC) in Moshi/Tanzania



Framework: Objectives for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration (GCM)

- Obj.4 Ensure that all migrants have proof of legal identity and adequate documentation
- Obj. 11: Manage borders in an integrated, secure and coordinated manner
- Obj 23. Strengthen international cooperation and global partnerships for safe, orderly and regular migration
- Other relevant frameworks; UN-LIEG, ID4D (WB), IOM Strategic Vision (2019), African Union, RECs (including SADC, ECOWAS, EAC, others)





The ICAO TRIP Framework



Objective: all Member States are able to uniquely identify individuals

- 38th ICAO GA in 2013
- Five components
- ICAO TRIP Roadmap developed
- IOM Action Plan for ICAO TRIP implementation

What does this mean?

- Innovation: expand and diversify
- Need to prioritize involvement



Building on IOM - ICAO MoU

- MoU in November 2016
- MoU consolidated and structures the ongoing IOM-ICAO cooperation
- MoU major area TRIP joint assistance project development & implementation
- TRIP Strategy implementation a huge challenge very ambitious
- ICAO focuses on developing standards and specifications
- Joint efforts are needed to make ICAO TRIP implemented globally
- Key concept: Linking ICAO's expertise and guidance materials with IOM's capacity to deliver results in the field
- IOM Action Plan for ICAO TRIP Implementation:
 - Aligned with ICAO TRIP Implementation Roadmap
 - Welcomed by TAG/TRIP/2
 - In close cooperation with NTWG and ICBWG =>>>>>



IOM Action Plan for ICAO TRIP Implementation: Focus areas for IOM work

- MRTD procurement: (e)Passport, visa, (e)ID card tenders, incl. MRTDs
- Evidence of Identity (EoI): advocacy, guidance and technical assistance also setting processes and workflows based on EoI principles
- Border management information systems (BMIS), either MIDAS or others
- PKI and PKD: promotion and technical support to increase the number of members a broad range of activities
- Capacity building for border officials: travel doc examination and beyond (PEPM 2 and ICAO training package)
- Assessments: focus on recommendations for future project development
- Document issuance and biometric data capturing in emergency and crisis environments to people in distress
- API possibly other interoperable applications and analyses tools such as watch lists, PNR. Developing analytics capabilities of border agencies.



Example: IOM's in-house Border Management Information System MIDAS

- ➤ Enhances both border facilitation and security
- Collects, processes, stores, retrieves, analyses and matches traveller information (incl. biometrics)
- ➤ Compatible with other Inspection Systems and Tools and Interoperable Applications incl. ASYCUDA (by UNCTAD)
- ➤ Highly customizable
- Affordable: funded by donors or Government or both post project support.
- > Robust and suitable for remote areas
- Governments have full and exclusive ownership of MIDAS' recorded traveler data; source code.
- ➤ Operates at 125 BCPs (land, air and sea) in 22 States

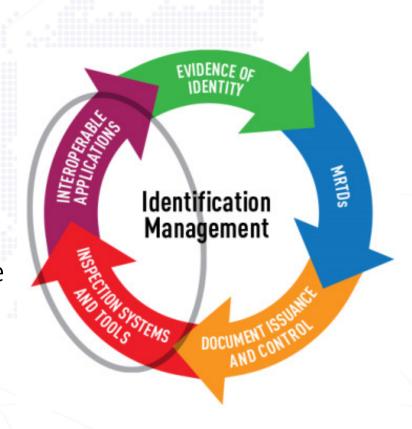

Example: Integrating MIDAS with other ICAO TRIP Interoperable Applications, Inspection Systems and Tools

- Interpol SLTD all, now mandatory; also VSAT connectivity
- National and international watch-lists
- Batch API compatible, e.g. Belize
- Certificate reading (PKD)
- ETA, e.g. South Sudan
- Verification against National ID Database
- Residence Permit/ Visa Extension Modules
- Interoperability with ASYCUDA (the UN's Customs Management IT system)



Technical assistance to States in traveller identification management
