Search and Rescue (SAR) – ICAO role

Roadmap of Search and Rescue (SAR) regulations

- 11 March 1977 – Angola become a member of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) and the International Maritime Organization (IMO)



Roadmap of Search and Rescue (SAR) regulations

- 1979 Angola ratified 19 conventions, including the International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea (SOLAS) and, on 17 July 2019, the multilateral maritime agreement.

- Angola Aeronautical Search and Rescue (SAR) services are under the responsibility of the National Air Force in coordination with Air Traffic Services



Roadmap of Search and Rescue (SAR) regulations

- Article 27(2) of Presidential Decree No. 96/23 of 6 April, the National Civil Aviation Authority is responsible for supervising, overseeing and regulating the aeronautical search and rescue system



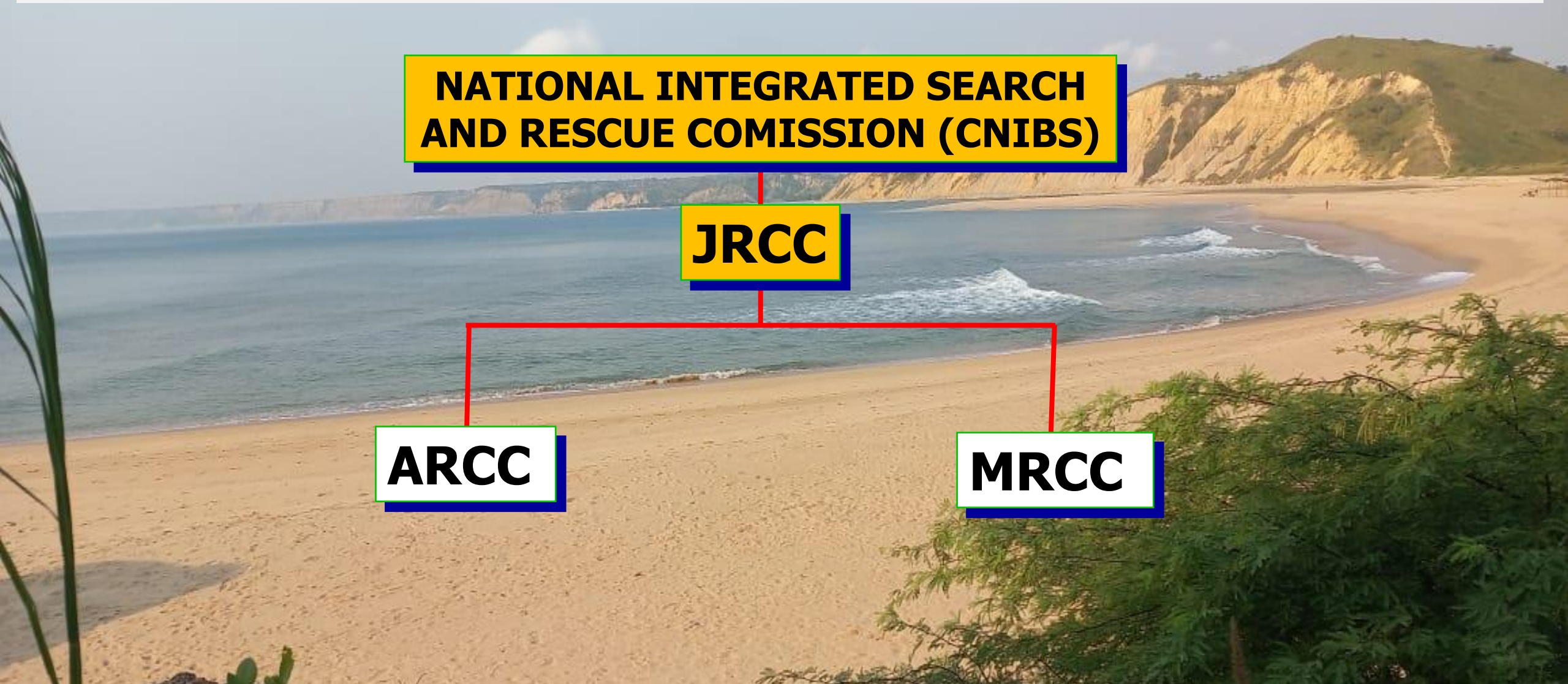
Structure of the National Integrated Search and Rescue System (SNIBS)

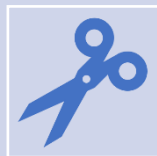
