Support for CAPEX Investments

Challenges

- Externalities (noise, air quality concerns, and land use)
- Socio-economic inequalities and limited access to decision-making
- Disparities across the European region

Opportunities

- Positive economic impact
- Community support ⇔ demonstrate concrete actions (ESG)
- Transparency and accountability































Key Strategies for Community Engagement

How to do it?



Transparency in communication

- Continuous dialogue with communities about the environmental impact of airport operations
- Involve community members in decision-making through forums, surveys, and public consultations

Collaborative planning

 Joint development of sustainability projects between airports and local community (e.g., green spaces, sponsoring projects for the local community)

Educational campaigns

 Raising awareness about environmental initiatives (e.g., sustainable fuels, carbon offset programs) within the community

Creating local economic opportunities

 Green jobs and training/information sessions for local populations in areas like renewable energy integration and sustainable airport operations, transport infrastructure

Accessibility Evaluation and Promotion for Air Travel and Tourism

ACCEPT


- The Accessibility Evaluation and Promotion for Air Travel and Tourism (ACCEPT) Program by IPADIS is an example of how community-driven initiatives can improve accessibility in aviation (AAK 2023)
- Ageing population and a growing market of air travelers with disabilities => addressing accessibility is not only a matter of social importance but also an economic imperative

Impact

• Enhanced the travel experience for over 45 million passengers (1.3 bn. people globally), focusing on equitable access to aviation & tourism (airports, airlines, other stakeholders)

How?

 Working with government stakeholders to ensure legal and regulatory framework of the state (including rules, orders, regulations, policies, operating procedures) is sufficiently solid to support accessibility developments
