#### AERODROME SAFETY AND OPERATIONAL PLANNING

## 1. Introduction

- 1.1 The Ninth Meeting of the Aerodrome Operational Planning Sub-Group (AOP SG/9) was held in Cairo, Egypt, 23 25 September 2013.
- 1.2 The Second Meeting of RASG-MID Steering Committee (RSC/2) was held in Amman, Jordan 28-30 October 2013.

## 2. DISCUSSION

- 2.1 The RSC/2 meeting supported a proposal from the AOP SG/9 to transfer the aerodrome safety issues from MIDANPIRG to RASG-MID since most of the activities related to Aerodrome Certification and Runway Safety would fit more within the RASG-MID framework.
- 2.2 In this regard, and in order to avoid duplication of efforts, the MIDANPIRG/14 meeting (Jeddah, Saudi Arabia, 15-19 December 2013) agreed that the activities of the AOP SG be transferred to the RASG-MID framework and endorsed the following Decision:

DECISION 14/10: TRANSFER OF AERODROMES ACTIVITIES TO RASG-MID

That,

a) the activities of the AOP SG and ADCI TF be transferred to the RASG-MID framework; and

- b) Aerodrome Specialists from MID States and ICAO continue to support MIDANPIRG and its subsidiary bodies for aerodromes-related Air Navigation matters.
- 2.3 Based on the above, the RSC/2 meeting suggested the establishment of a Working Group for Runway and Ground Safety (RGS WG) under the MID Regional Aviation Safety Team (MID-RAST) to address all aerodromes safety issues. Accordingly, the meeting agreed to the following Draft Decision:

# DRAFT DECISION 3/XX: ESTABLISHMENT OF RUNWAY AND GROUND SAFETY WORKING GROUP (RGS WG)

That,

- a) Runway and Ground Safety (RGS) Working Group is established with Terms of Reference (TOR) as at **Appendix A** to this working paper; and
- b) States appoint member and alternate for the RGS Working Group.

### 3. ACTION BY THE MEETING

3.1 The meeting is invited to agree on the Draft Decision in paragraph 2.3 above.

# RUNWAY AND GROUND SAFETY WORKING GROUP (RGS WG)

#### TERMS OF REFERENCE

#### A) PURPOSE OF THE RGS WG:

The RGS WG is established to promote the runway and ground safety in the MID Region in line with the MID Aviation Safety Strategy. It will support the RASG-MID Steering Committee (RSC) and Regional Aviation Safety Team (MID-RAST) in the development, implementation, and monitoring of Safety Enhancement Initiatives (SEIs) related to the RGS Focus Area (FA).

### In order to meet its Terms of Reference, the RGS WG shall:

- 1) develop SEIs and mitigation measures through Detailed Implementation Plans (DIPs) related to aerodrome and runway safety matters, such as:
  - a) Runway excursions;
  - b) Runway Excursions;
  - c) Aerodrome Certification;
  - d) Safety Management Systems (SMS) implementation for aerodromes;
  - e) Aerodrome Emergency Planning;
  - f) Wildlife Control;
  - g) FOD Prevention; and
  - h) Aerodrome Safety Oversight.
- 2) provide recommended actions through the development of DIPs for each SEI, in a prioritized manner;
- 3) monitor the implementation of DIPs and provide feedback to the RSC;
- 4) assist MID-States to establish Runway Safety Teams;
- 5) propose input to the MID-RAST for the development of the RASG-MID yearly work programme; and
- 6) undertake other functions relevant to runway and ground safety and aerodrome operational planning.

## C) ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- RGS WG Rapporteur Coordinate RGS activities and provide overall guidance and leadership;
- RGS Coordinators Provide technical expertise and collaborate in the development of SEIs and DIPs related to assigned FA, as requested by the RGS Rapporteur;
- ICAO Support; and
- Partners Provide technical expertise and collaborate in the development of material as requested by the RGS Rapporteur.
