1. Introduction

1.1 This paper is prepared by the representative of IRAN Airport Company to present a new sample of SAR LOA for the MID States and consider the governess consideration with special circumstances of MID Region.

2. DISCUSSIONS

- 2.1 During the preparation of the SAR LoA Sample at **Appendix A** to this working paper the following issues have been considered:
 - a) lack of complete, comprehensive and signature between contracting state in MID for SAR LOA;
 - b) review and modify the sample of DOC 9731 for MID needs; and
 - c) consider the States' rights, mutual respect of operation, political and military consideration.

3.1.2 Desiring to support the provisions of the Convention on International

Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO)

and of the provision of expeditious and effective SAR services;

3.1.3 Seeking to provide an overall plan for SAR co-ordination, co-operation use of available resources, mutual assistance, and efforts to improve SAR services within their SRR;

4. RESPONSIBILIY

4.1	Responsibilities for the initiation of the appropriate SAR co-ordination shall rest with the RCC having responsibility for own SRR.

4.3	RCC and RCC should be bearing in mind consistency with the principles of international law and the goals of, ICAO and the States and organizations concerned.

4.5	Furthermore, the provision of SAR services within an SRR shall be without regard to the nationality or circumstances of the persons in distress.				
4.6	RCC andRCC should not entry to each other SRRs for SAR provisions andRCC andRCC are responsible for SAR operation within their SRR.				
4.7	This agreement addresses sensitive issues to the degree necessary for SAR co-operation between				
5.	EXTENT OF ASSISTANCERCC andRCC agree to co-operate in the following areas:				
5.1	Support each other by pooling SAR information as appropriate for operations within their respective search and rescue regions (SRRs);				
5.2	Respond to requests for information assistance between the designated rescue coordination centers (RCCs)				
5.3	Develop message appropriate for co-ordination of both Parties, responding to the same distress incident and for co-ordination betweenRCC andRCC of;				

- 5.4 If practicable apply the guidance of the International Aeronautical and Maritime SAR Manuals regarding SAR operational procedures and communications;
- 5.5 Work to establish agreed procedures, which balance concerns for Sovereignty and for saving lives; and
- 5.6.1 Mutual visits by SAR personnel of both Parties by prior invitation;
- 5.6.2 Joint training or exercises if practicable;
- 5.6.3 Co-operation in development of SAR procedures, techniques for improvement of SAR operation;
- 5.6.4 Exchange of SAR operation information if applicable; and
- 5.6.5 Establishment of SAR committees betweenRCC andRCC to provide a means for ongoing co-operation for improving SAR effectiveness by prior invitation.

6. SEARCH AND RESCUE REGIONS

- 6.1 SRR ofRCC andRCC are coincident with corresponding flight information regions (FIR) with respect to those areas over the high seas, maritime search and rescue regions.
- 6.2 It should be recognized that the establishment of SRRs is mainly for ensuring the availability of SAR services, and to facilitate proper distribution of distress alerts to RCCs; SRRs may be viewed as affecting political boundaries, and need to align with political boundaries and the Parties do not sake of each boundaries.
- 6.3 Establishment of SRRs is intended only to effect an understanding concerning whereRCC andRCC accepts responsibility for co-coordinating or providing SAR services within SSRs. SRRs chart of the

7. TERMS OF AGREEMENT

- 7.1 Keep information readily available on which may be needed for implementing this Agreement.
- 7.2 Authorize to request assistance via each other and to provide all information on the distress situation and the scope of assistance may be needed;
- 7.4 arrange in advance, with national authorities.
- 7.5 Normally fund its own activities in relation to this Agreement unless otherwise arranged by the Parties in advance.

8. AMENDMENTS

- 8.1 Any change of this agreement, including its cancelation or replacement, requires the consent of the parties concerned. This applies to the substance of the change as well as to its date of applicability. Any change shall be made either in the context of a meeting between two parties, or by exchange of correspondence with acknowledgment by all signatories.

9. **DEVIATIONS**

Any deviation from this provision, that arises due to an emergency or are applied to ensure the safety of life, shall immediately notified to the other RCC concerned and shall be terminated as soon as the circumstances that caused the deviation case exist .
