Feb – June 2017	Development of training material
June 2017	Submission to ICAO GAT for approval
July 2017	Evaluation and approval by ICAO
August 2017	Implementation



Training format

- Title: CAPSCA Technical Advisors Awareness Course
- Aim: develop a critical mass of experts to support the CAPSCA programme
- Reference material: ICAO, WHO, International aviation organisations
- Primary audience: Representatives of national civil aviation and/or public health authorities from ICAO Member States, or qualified specialists in aviation medicine, emergency medicine, or public health



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Training format

- Secondary audience: CAPSCA Member State National Aviation Authorities (NAAs) managers or head of departments.
- On-line course of 30 hours
- Provide a discussion forum for case studies and real-life scenario's and practical exercises
- Certificated issued
- Need to do practical OTJ training to be assigned as technical advisor for CAPSCA
