IATA and its Role in the Airline Business


IATA represents, leads and serves the airline industry.

- Represents: IATA advocates for the interest of airlines, making governments aware of their contribution to economic growth and supporting sensible regulations.
- **Leads**: IATA establishes protocols to ensure a safer, more efficient and more environmentally friendly industry. Safety is IATA's number one priority. Example: IOSA, a safety audit program standardizing safety procedures to help all airlines follow leading safety practices.
- Serves: IATA helps airlines efficiently interact with each other.





The Airlines Industry: the global view



- **65.5 million jobs** supported by aviation worldwide
- 3.6% of global GDP is supported by aviation
- Airlines facilitate global migration and the mix of people from different cultural backgrounds



The Airlines Industry: the African view




- Air transport supports **6.2 million jobs**
- \$55.8 billion in GDP in Africa is supported by aviation
- In addition, travel and tourism supported 4.9 million people in employment and contributed \$35.9 billion to GDP in Africa's economies

The Airlines Industry: the Middle East view



- Air transport supports **2.4 million jobs**
- \$157.2 billion in GDP in the Middle East is supported by aviation
- In addition, travel and tourism supported 1.3 million people in employment and contributed \$66 billion to GDP in the Middle East's economies

Factors that stimulate air traffic (out of our hands)



- The income of travelers (disposable income) and level of economic activity (including consumer and business confidence)
- The distribution of wealth and the type of economic activity
- Other factors related to the quality and availability of air services (safety, frequency, comfort)
- · Ethnic, cultural and trade links
- Attraction of the destination for leisure
- Maturity effects (number of days available for holiday)
- Advantageous geographic location
- Freedom to travel easily & a desire to travel
