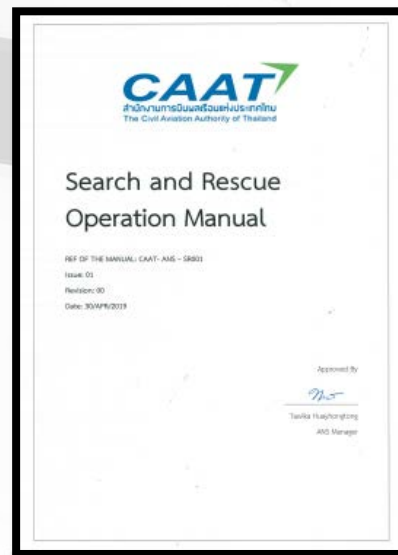

ASEAN AGREEMENT ON AERONAUTICAL AND MARITIME SEARCH AND RESCUE COOPERATION

The Governments of Brunei Darussalam, the Kingdom of Cambodia, the Republic of Indonesia, the Lao People's Democratic Republic, Malaysia, the Republic of the Union of Myanmar, the Republic of the Philippines, the Republic of Singapore, the Kingdom of Thailand and the Socialist Republic of Viet Nam, Member States of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Member States" or individually as the "Member State");

RECALLING the ASEAN Declaration on Cooperation in Search and Rescue of Persons and Vessels in Distress at Sea by ASEAN Foreign Ministers signed on 27 October 2010 in Hanoi, Vietnam and the Joint Ministerial Statement of the 18th ASEAN Transport Ministers Meeting in 2012 in Bali, Indonesia, the Ministers had agreed to intensify aeronautical and maritime search and rescue (SAR) cooperation by establishing the ASEAN Transport SAR Forum to enhance cooperation for efficient aeronautical and maritime SAR operations in the region;

RECALLING also the Agreement for the Facilitation of Search for Aircrafts in Distress and Rescue of Survivors of Aircraft Accidents signed on 14 April 1972 in Singapore and the Agreement for the Facilitation of Search of Ships in Distress and Rescue of Survivors of Ship Accidents, signed on 15 May 1975 in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia;
