Resolution WHA74.7 May 2021: Establish a Working Group for emergency preparedness and response (WGPR)


## Categories for implementation of the proposed recommendations

- amending or building on existing frameworks (IHR (2005) and WHA resolutions/decisions)
- new WHO international agreement(s)/instrument(s)

# Legal Basis of the WHO Pandemic Agreement

- The Agreement is expected to be endorsed by the WHA under Article 19 of the WHO Constitution,
- The Conference of parties will be the governing body
- The SG of the UN will be serving as the Depositary.



# Scope and Principles of the WHO Pandemic Agreement

- ✓ The Agreement is guided by **equity** to ensure fair pandemic prevention, preparedness, and response.
- ✓ It upholds **state sovereignty, human rights, and international humanitarian law**.
- ✓ Emphasizes **solidarity, inclusivity, transparency, and the use of the best available science**.
- ✓ Gives special attention to the needs and capacities of **developing countries and vulnerable populations**.

# PA Resolution - Summary of the Next Steps & timeline (As per 12th May 2025)

Milestone	Timeline / Deadline	Details / Actions
Adoption of WHO Agreement	2025 (WHA78)	Adopted under Article 19 of the WHO Constitution.
Opening for Signature	After WHA adopts Annex (Article 12)	Signature begins after WHA adopts the Annex; to take place at WHO HQ and later at UN HQ.
Adoption of Annex by WHA	WHA79 (May 2026)	IGWG to submit negotiated Annex to WHA79
Inter Governmental Working Group (IGWG) Organizational Meeting	No later than 15 July 2025	Elect Bureau (2 Co-Chairs, 4 Vice-Chairs), agree on methods and program of work.
Entry into Force of Agreement	30 Days following the date of deposit of the sixtieth instrument of ratification	States encouraged to sign, ratify, approve, or accede promptly to bring Agreement (with Annex) into force quickly.
Preparations for First Conference of the Parties (CoP)	Before first CoP (TBD)	IGWG to oversee CoP preparations: rules of procedure, budget, reporting mechanisms, etc.
Director-General to Report to WHA	WHA80 (May 2027)	First report on progress toward entry into force and CoP preparations.


- Being led by the MS of the WHO through (WGIHR).

- Introducing the pandemic emergency.
- Commitment to access, solidarity and equity.
- Establishment of the States Parties Committee and Coordinated Financial Mechanism.
- Creation of National IHR Authorities




# Modernizing Health Security: IHR Amendments on PoE, Digital Health Certificates, recommendations & PHSMs (1)

- **Clear Responsibilities for Conveyance Operators (Article 24):**
- Specifies the application of public health measures on board, as well as during embarkation and disembarkation.
- **Digital Health Documents – Now a Global Standard (Article 35 & Annex 6)** Promotes the use of digital health certificates for vaccination, prophylaxis, and laboratory results.
  - Ensures that non-digital (paper) formats remain valid, accessible, and signed by authorized officials.
- **Managing Both Exposed and Infected Individuals (Article 27)**
- **Boosting Laboratory Capacities at PoEs (Annex 1B)**
- Strengthens core capacities at designated Points of Entry, including laboratory diagnostics and specimen transport.

2. State party **implementation committee** (IHR article 54 bis)
3. Coordinated **financial mechanism** (IHR article 44, and 44bis)
