




- 2000 the Public Health Authority joined the Airport Emergency Committee


- 2001 Antrax white powder
- First suspected case was on an aircraft at Lisbon Airport (28/9/2001)
 - Airport Emergency Committee (EC) activated for the 1rst time for a Public Health event
 - Lab result only the next day (no PCR at the time)
 - The plane was authorized to fly by the Minister of Health himself
 - PHA risk communication to the crew and to the passengers (POR and ENG)
- Last suspected case at Lisbon Airport with EC activation July 7, 2005 (7:00 am)
- Airport Contingency Plan for Antrax 1rst Public Health Contingency Plan as an annex to Airport Emergency Plan
- No cases in Portugal until today



2009 AH1N1nv – Pandemic




- National guidance for air travelers (aimed at travelers and all stakeholders)
 - Airport Contingency Plan for AH1N1nv Flu
 - No cases detected at Points of Entry
 - First 37 diagnosed cases were imported air travel



- 2014 Ebola Public Health Emergency International Concern (PHEIC)
 - National guidance for air travelers (aimed at travelers and all stakeholders)
 - Airport Preparedness and Response plan for Ebola
 - 9 suspected cases in Portugal all detected at Lisbon airport
 - No cases in Portugal



- 2020 COVID-19 Public Health Emergency International Concern (PHEIC)
- National guidance for air travelers (aimed at travelers and all stakeholders)
- Airport Preparedness and Response plan for COVID-19
 - presented at Lisbon Airport FALSEC meeting on January 30, 2020 (1rst cases 2/3/2020)
 - updated monthly in the first 2 months and each one or two weeks from April 2020 onwards
 - PLF
 - Tests (crews excluded)
 - Masks
 - Contact tracing Quarantine
- Travel legislation coming out every week (national and EU)





As for Civil Aviation

Airports are local levels where infectious outbreaks (or any other public health event) may occur


- The coordination between partners and stakeholders must have the commitment of everyone
