BAHRAIN	COVID-19 entry regulations lifted on 15 March 2022
Egypt	COVID-19 entry regulations lifted on 17 June 2022
Iran	1. Passengers must have: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - a COVID-19 vaccination certificate in English showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 14 days before arrival; or - a negative COVID-19 PCR or RT-PCR test taken at most 72 hours before arrival. - This does not apply to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - nationals of Iran; - passengers younger than 12 years. 2. Passengers could be subject to a COVID-19 test upon arrival and quarantine at their own expense.
Iraq	COVID-19 entry regulations lifted on 1 December 2022.
Jordan	Passengers must complete a "Declaration Form" before departure at https://www.gateway2jordan.gov.jo . This will generate a QR code which must be presented before boarding and upon arrival. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - This does not apply to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - nationals of Jordan, their spouses and children; - passengers who do not need prior approval to enter Jordan; - passengers with a permanent diplomatic QR code.
KUWAIT	COVID-19 entry regulations lifted on 1 May 2022.
Lebanon	COVID-19 entry regulations lifted on 27 September 2022.
Libya	1. Passengers must have a COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they were fully vaccinated at least 14 days before arrival. Vaccines accepted are: AstraZeneca (SK Bioscience), AstraZeneca (Vaxzevria), Covaxin, Covishield, Covovax, Janssen, Moderna (Spikevax), Nuvaxovid (Novavax), Pfizer-BioNTech (Comirnaty), Sinopharm (BIBP) and Sinovac. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - This does not apply to passengers younger than 12 years. 2. Passengers could be subject to a COVID-19 rapid antigen test upon arrival.

OMAN	COVID-19 entry regulations lifted on 22 May 2022
QATAR	COVID-19 entry regulations lifted on 1 November 2022.
Saudi Arabia	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Passengers who in the past 14 days have been in Iran are not allowed to enter. 2. Passengers with a visit visa must have medical insurance to cover COVID-19 expenses. 3. Passengers traveling to perform Umrah must have a confirmed return ticket. 4. Airlines can check the validity of the exit/entry visas for residents of Saudi Arabia at https://muqem.sa/#/visa-validity/check
Sudan	COVID-19 entry regulations lifted on 2 August 2022
Syria	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Flights to Syria are suspended. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - This does not apply to Aleppo (ALP), Damascus (DAM) and Kameshly (KAC). 2. The following passengers are allowed to enter: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - nationals and residents of Syria; - passengers with a diplomatic passport; - passengers with a visa issued by Syria; - students registered in Syrian schools or universities. - passengers with proof of being: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - spouses of nationals of Syria; - children of mothers who are nationals of Syria. 3. Passengers could be subject to a COVID-19 PCR test upon arrival. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - This does not apply to passengers younger than 12 years. 4. Passengers must have a "Passenger Locator Form" (PLF) and present it upon arrival. 5. Passengers could be subject to self-isolation or quarantine

Yemen	COVID-19 entry regulations lifted on 17 March 2022
