#### Fifth Meeting of the Directors General of Civil Aviation-Middle East Region (DGCA-MID/5) Kuwait, 4-6 November 2019



At the Fifth Meeting of Directors General of Civil Aviation for the ICAO Middle East Region (DGCA-MID/5) held in Kuwait City, ICAO Secretary General Dr. Fang Liu underscored that the continued enhancement of the implementation of ICAO's safety, security, and sustainability standards and recommended practices (SARPs), strategies, and other initiatives, is unlocking tremendous economic and other sustainable development benefits in the region.

Her keynote address echoed ICAO's advocacy for the benefits of aviation in terms of the achievement of the UN's 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. ICAO promotes awareness, including at the level of State leadership, of the various ways by which the international connectivity established through civil aviation directly support 15 of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) under Agenda 2030.

"The ICAO Middle East Region has been one of the fastest-growing in the world for passenger and cargo traffic since 2011," Dr Liu declared, noting that regional air carriers are recording 4-5% growth rates for passenger and freight traffic and that a 10% increase in tourist arrivals by air occurred in 2018. "Aviation presently supports more than 2.4 million jobs and contributes USD 130 billion to GDP in MID Region GDP. Each of your States has the primary responsibility to ensure that sufficient infrastructure, human resources, training, and other capacities are in place to accommodate and manage forecast traffic growth."

This will involve ensuring that local and national aviation planning is aligned with SARPs and structured on the basis of the targets and frameworks established in ICAO's Global Plans for Aviation Safety (GASP), Air Navigation Capacity and Efficiency (GANP), and Aviation Security (GASeP).



"I commend the MID on the aviation safety performance being achieved, even as traffic figures continue to rise. The MID Accident rate of 2.3 accidents per million departures is better than the Global Rate and the regional effective implementation of SARPs has increased from 70.5 to 75.23 %—a significant improvement compared to other regions."

"I commend the spirit of cooperation and respect for safety prioritization exemplified by the rapid addressing of several air traffic management (ATM) operational challenges through the MID Contingency Coordination Teams (CCTs) and ATM Contingency Plan," Dr. Liu said.

The meeting was attended by a total of Sixty-Six (66) participants from Fifteen (15) States (Bahrain, Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Oman, Palestine, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Syria, United Arab Emirates, United Kingdom, United States and Yemen) and Eight (8) International/Regional Organizations (ACAO, ACI, CANSO, GCC, IATA, IFALPA, IFATSEA and TSA).

The MIDAMC STG/5 meeting was generously hosted by IATA Office in Amman.




#### Joint ICAO/ACAO Airport Collaborative Decision Making (A-CDM) Workshop Cairo, Egypt, 20 - 22 October 2019

As the aviation ecosystem becomes more connected and global aviation continues to experience regular attacks on several fronts, Cyber Security became a key challenge for the aviation industry. Acknowledging the urgency and importance of protecting civil aviation's critical infrastructure, information and communication technology systems and data against cyber threats, ICAO MID Office organized the Cyber Security and Resilience Symposium from 15 to 17 October 2019 in Amman, Jordan, as we progress our collaborative discussion with experts and delegates from the operational, governmental, business and technical Cyber Security communities across the Middle East and beyond.

The objective of the Cyber Security and Resilience Symposium was to empower the aviation industry with prevention measures to mitigate the exploitation of critical information system and fostering a cyber-security culture that promotes a resilient and secure cyberspace.

The event was attended by more than 128 participants from more than 25 country.



### Fifth Meeting of the MIDANPIRG Air Traffic Management Sub-Group (ATM SG/5) and Coordination Meeting for the MID Flight Procedure Programme (MID FPP) Aqaba, Jordan, 1 – 5 December 2019



The Fifth meeting of the MIDANPIRG Air Traffic Management Sub-Group (ATM SG/5) and the Coordination Meeting for the MID Flight Procedure Programme (MID FPP) were kindly hosted by the Civil Aviation Regulatory Commission (CARC) of Jordan, from 1 to 5 December 2019.

The ATM SG/5 Meeting was attended by forty-seven (47) participants from ten (10) States (Bahrain, Cyprus, Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, UAE and United States of America) and four (4) Organizations (ACAO, EUROCONTROL, IATA and MIDRMA); and the MID FPP meeting was attended by twenty six (26) participants from Bahrain, Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, UAE, IATA and ICAO.











At the Twelfth ICAO Air Services Negotiation Event held in Aqaba, Jordan, 2-6 December 2019, the ICAO Council President Dr. Olumuyiwa Benard Aliu encouraged progress towards liberalized and harmonized regulatory frameworks for air transport, and highlighted the importance of air connectivity for sustainable development, particularly for the Middle East.

"Besides the fact that air connectivity generates over 2.4 million jobs in this Region, and \$130 billion dollars in Middle East Gross Domestic Product (GDP), it's important to note as well that just over half of this significant economic impact is generated exclusively by foreign tourists who are arriving by air," Dr Aliu declared. "With an impressive annual growth rate of 4.6 per cent being forecast for Regional traffic through 2045, I think it's clear to all concerned that the continued optimization of local and international air connectivity remains critical to the future economic vitality of MID States and businesses."

The event was attended by a total of 578 participants from 61 States, 7 international organizations, 12 industry representatives. ICAN 2019 resulted in negotiators agreeing 400 new air service agreements, opening the door for the expansion of connectivity to the global civil aviation network. While in Jordan for the 2019 ICAN event, President Aliu met with the Jordanian Honourable Minister of Transport, Dr. Khalid Walid Saif. The Minister thanked ICAO for its No Country Left Behind initiative and reassured the President of the commitment of the government to a safe, secure and environmentally friendly aviation industry in Jordan. The President thanked the Minister and affirmed that ICAO will continue to work with its member States for the growth of the industry.









#### ICAO Trans-Regional Civil-Military Cooperation Workshop Abu Dhabi, UAE, 9 – 12 December 2019



The Workshop was gratefully hosted by the United Arab Emirates and organized jointly by ICAO Asia Pacific, Europe and North Atlantic and Middle East Regional Offices and supported by ICAO Headquarters; the workshop was held from 9 to 12 December 2019. The Workshop was attended by a total of sixty-seven (67) participants from fifteen (15) States (Algeria, Bahrain, Egypt, Finland, Indonesia, Iraq, Iran, Jordan,

Kuwait, Romania, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Thailand, UAE and USA) and four (4) Organizations (EUROCONTROL, GCC, IATA and IFALPA).










#### Aviation Security Risk Management Workshop Cairo, Egypt, 15 – 18 December 2019










#### **CRV** — The Aviation Network for Tomorrow

#### From Montreal to Cairo ICAO 75 Years of Connecting the World

The first successful flight of a powered controlled and sustained flying machine by Orville and Wilbur Wright on 17 December 1903 was the beginning of the evolution of flight and civil aviation. It was also the fulfilment of the centuries-old dream of flight passionately shared by early aviators in many countries including the Arab inventor Abbas ibn Firnas.


For more than a century, air transport takes people and cargo around the world, and like bees pollinating the world economy, it has been the catalyst for fundamental economic, social and cultural transformation. The structuring of civil aviation was greatly helped by international cooperation through the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), established in 1944 by the Chicago Convention, the landmark agreement on aviation signed by 54 nations, to promote cooperation, to breakdown borders and frontiers and to create and preserve friendship leading to a better understanding among the nations and peoples of the world.

Seventy-five years later, the International Civil Aviation network carries over four billion passengers annually. The global Air Transport sector supports 65.5 million jobs and USD 2.7 trillion in global economic activity, with over 10 million women and men working within the industry to ensure 120,000 flights, 12 million passengers and around USD 18 billion worth of goods are carried safely to their destinations. Aviation provides the only rapid worldwide transportation network, generating economic growth, creating jobs, and facilitating international trade and tourism. Aviation has become the enabler of global business and is now also being recognized by the international community as an essential enabler to achieving the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

#### The International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO)

A specialized agency of the United Nations, ICAO was created in 1944 to promote the safe and orderly development of international civil aviation throughout the world. It sets standards and regulations necessary for aviation safety, security, efficiency, capacity and environmental protection, amongst many other priorities.

The Organization serves as the forum for cooperation in all fields of civil aviation among its 193 Member States.



ICAO embodies the spirit of cooperation and dedication of 193 Member States and industry groups to reach consensus on international civil aviation Standards and Recommended Practices (SARPs) and policies in support of a safe, efficient, secure, economically sustainable and environmentally responsible civil aviation sector. These SARPs and policies are used by ICAO Member States to ensure that their local civil aviation operations and regulations conform to global norms, which in turn permits global network to operate safely and reliably in every region of the world.

#### **ICAO** Regional Offices

Among the notable achievements of ICAO, as an international organization, its regional organization has demonstrated to be an essential machinery to carry devotion to a one-world concept of cooperation for setting international standards and regulations in civil aviation among its respective member states. ICAO maintains seven Regional Offices to provide closer support and coordination for Member States to which it is accredited:

- Asia and Pacific (APAC) Office in Bangkok, Thailand
- Eastern and Southern African (ESAF) Office in Nairobi, Kenya
- European and North Atlantic (EUR/NAT) Office in Paris, France
- Middle East (MID) Office in Cairo, Egypt
- North American, Central American & Caribbean (NACC) Office in Mexico City, Mexico
- South American (SAM) Office in Lima, Peru
- Western and Central African (WACAF) Office in Dakar, Senegal











#### **ICAO MID Regional Office- Cairo**

Egypt was one of the pioneer States that joined ICAO and signed the agreement on 13th March 1947. As a leader and hub of aviation in the world, Cairo was therefore a natural choice to host the first Middle East Regional Air Navigation Meeting (MERAN Meeting) which was convened 1 to 18 October 1946 at the Palace Hotel in Heliopolis. It was attended by 150 delegates and advisers, representing 15 States and 5 international organizations.

Egypt has graciously hosted ICAO MID Office in 1947 and played since then great leadership and outstanding achievements in Civil Aviation. "Egypt is one of the leading countries that joined the ICAO and signed the Chicago Convention on 13 March 1947" said H.E. Lt. General Younis al-Masri, Minister of Civil Aviation of the Arab Republic of Egypt, adding that there is close cooperation between the Egyptian aviation sector and ICAO in the field of civil aviation safety and security. Egypt is complying with the rules, recommendations and legislation of the Organization, adopts all its initiatives, and supports them by all technical means in order to achieve its strategic objectives in terms of international civil aviation safety and security and sustainable growth of air transport.

#### **ICAO** and The Future

In a little over a century, our industry has gone from learning to fly, to learning to fly faster, learning to fly further, learning to fly heavier planes. The air transport industry is expanding, and the future of aviation is a bright one. The most recent estimates suggest that demand for air transport will increase by an average of 4.3% per annum over the next 20 years. By 2036 the air transport industry will then contribute 15.5 million in direct jobs and \$1.5 trillion of GDP to the world economy, and with the impacts of global tourism into account, these numbers could rise to 97.8 million jobs and \$5.7 trillion in GDP. By mid-2030s no fewer than 200,000 flights per day are expected to take off and land all over the world. These figures are dazzling and reflect a dynamic sector which is great.

The growing demand for air traffic also involves challenges, not least of which are the important logistical implications in and around airports to ensure the infrastructure is able to support this growth. As the industry plans to support a near doubling of passenger and cargo numbers by 2036, demand for pilots, engineers, air traffic controllers and other aviation-related jobs is expected to rise dramatically. What is also certain is that innovations in technology and approaches will be needed to sustain this growth.

Aviation has truly been at the forefront of innovation to become one of the safest and most reliable modes of transportation in the world today. Innovations in aviation will surely impact the wider transport sector as well as the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development. "Whether we're focused on the increasing prevalence of drone operations or commercial space transport, ICAO has been grateful for the proactive inputs from States, Governments, and other air transport stakeholders as we seek to anticipate and close the gaps that might constrain future air transport growth and innovation," Dr. Fang Liu- ICAO Secretary General emphasized.

As 2019 marks the great celebration of "75 years of connecting the world", the MID Office wishes all the aviation industry and stakeholders success and innovation in soaring up high in the sky to enhance safety, security for the benefit of the aviation industry and all humanity. We appreciate the efforts of our member states in MID Region for their outstanding achievements in Civil Aviation and their continuous efforts to contribute positively to the development of the air transport industry, and for the tremendous safety and security records that the aviation has achieved due of their commitment and dedication.

Special thanks to the Arab Republic of Egypt, the gracious host of the ICAO MID Office and to the national carrier EGYPTAIR for joining ICAO in celebration of this milestone anniversary.
