Purpose of GASP



- Purpose of GASP is to continually reduce fatalities & risk of fatalities
 - associated with accidents
 - by guiding harmonized development and implementation of regional/national plans
- States, regions and industry facilitate implementation of GASP
 - through coordinated SEIs
- Through GASP, ICAO prioritizes global action in areas of aviation safety
 - by addressing currently identified Risk Categories of Occurrences (HRCs)



Role of RASGs

- Supporting/monitoring progress of achieving GASP goals at regional level
- Developing and implementing regional aviation safety plan
 - consistent with GASP
 - coordinating implementation of SEIs at regional level
- Structuring work in line with GASP
- Identifying safety risks and issues of priority
 - encouraging States to initiate action using roadmap







Proposed GASP Goals: 2020-2022

- 1. Achieve continuous reduction of ops safety risks
- 2. Strengthen States' safety oversight capabilities
- 3. Implement effective State safety programmes
- 4. Increase collaboration at regional level
- 5. Expand use of industry programmes
- 6. Ensure appropriate infrastructure is available to support safe ops




Implementation of Global Plans

13th Air Navigation Conference (AN-Conf/13)
 Theme: Developing for Implementation

Recommendation 7.3/1 — ICAO implementation strategies

That ICAO:

- a) strengthen the linkage between the Global Air Navigation Plan (GANP), the Global Aviation Safety Plan (GASP) and the Global Aviation Security Plan (GASeP) to achieve an integrated implementation approach;
- b) take into account implementation support needs when developing provisions


Upcoming Global Events 2019
