GASP-SG began process of reviewing GASP


• 2026-2028 GASP signals start of new 6-year cycle

- Scope of revision is significant > review of
 - GASP structure
 - Global safety issues
 - Goals, targets, and indicators

Several data sources

- Accident & serious incident data (ICAO, IATA, FSF)
- USOAP data, incl. trends
- Other ICAO sources, such as iSTARS
- RASPs from all Regions




- Use of Standardized Frameworks for ORG & HRCs

Main Findings

Global ORG Challenges 2026-2028

Lack of sufficient financial resources for safety oversight authority to meet national and international obligations

Lack of qualified technical personnel, primarily in AIG & AGA

Lack of regulatory process to address resolution of safety issues, primarily in AGA

Low level of SSP implementation at global level



Deficiencies in safety data & safety information collection, analysis, and exchange, to support safety management activities





Outcomes of AN-Conf/14

- Agreed with all global safety issues
 - Including G-HRCs + additional categories

Agreed with all GASP Goals & Targets

- Two RECs on global safety strategy:
 - one related to draft 2026-2028 GASP
 - another on Global Plans alignment
 - +additional REC under GASP, on TURB

Outcomes of AN-Conf/14 (Cont'd)

WPs related to ORG challenges

- Regional collaboration, incl. sharing of data & BPs
- Proposals mainly affect Roadmap

WPs related to OPS safety risks

- Use of existing initiatives to address risks
- Proactive safety performance measurements
- Human Factors & safety culture
- Proposals mainly affect Roadmap



Outcomes of AN-Conf/14 (Cont'd)

- WPs on Global Plans alignment
 - Agreed with all GPTF RECs + GASP-SG actions



RECs and actions included:

- Work towards a common performance framework (long-term integration)
- Revise roles & responsibilities in both Plans
- Revise process for Global Plans' development
- Define respective scopes & time horizons in each Global Plan



Questionnaire on GASP Update

- Majority of respondents noted GASP helps identify ORG challenges & Ops safety risks
 - Main ORG challenge: effective State safety oversight capabilities
 - Runway incursion and excursion are main HRCs
 - SDCPS is a top challenge for SSP implementation
 - GASP targets related to SSP implementation are the most challenging to achieve
- Majority of respondents have NASP
 - in line with GASP & RASP
 - a third are published and being implemented
 - NASP contributes to SSP implementation





- Vast majority of respondents in favor of proposals for 2026-2028 GASP
 - no additional proposal made for GASP content or guidance/tools

Post AN-Conf/14 Work



Addressing AN-Conf/14 RECs

- GASP-SG analyzed every REC of each WP (AI1.2 & 2.3)
- Majority of RECs impact GM (mainly Roadmap)
 - To be addressed during GASP-SG/15 in end March
- Main inputs into GASP
 - Scope & time horizon
 - GASP development and revision process
 - Roles and responsibilities in aviation safety planning
 - Guidance on how Global Plans support each other
 - List of HRC contributing factors (Questionnaire feedback)
 - Emerging issues expanded to address innovation
 - Removed duplicate indicators GASP Goals & Targets

Content of A42-WP on GASP

Intent of WP

- Picks up where AN-Conf/14 left off
- Explains revision process
- Describes amendments (vs. 2023-2025 edition)
- Calls for amendment of A41-6
- Seeks endorsement of new GASP

A41-6 revision

- Aims to make RES future proof
- Address high-level issues without going into details
- Contains small editorial changes
- Completes revision cycle started for 2020-2022 GASP





Next Steps

- ANC to conduct final review of GASP in mid-May
- GASP presented to Council approval in June
- A42 WP (incl. GASP) published end of June
- Deadline to receive A-WPs from States & IOs by end July



GASP presented for endorsement at A42 then published in Oct



GM published by Dec 2025
