

Graham Braithwaite

Graham Braithwaite is Professor of Safety and Accident Investigation at Cranfield University. He has over 20 years experience in the design and delivery of training in accident investigation, safety management and human factors. In 2011, he led the University's successful bid for a Queen's Anniversary Prize - the highest honour for a UK academic institution - for its work in aviation safety including establishing the world's first Masters programme for aircraft accident investigators. Since 2015, he has held a senior management role at the University with responsibility for the Transport Systems Theme - an activity that covers activities ranging from autonomous vehicles to airport design and from a new £67m Digital Aviation Research and Technology Centre to the University's flying operation. In 2019, he led a second successful bid for a Queen's Anniversary Prize, this time based on the University's flying classroom and laboratory.

Graham is an independent member of the TUI Northern Region Airlines Safety Review Board and the Independent Safety Adviser to the British Airways Board. He is a Fellow of the International Society of Air Safety Investigators and also the Royal Aeronautical Society.
