Purpose of Safety Investigation

Annex 13

"The sole objective of the investigation of an accident or incident shall be the prevention of accidents and incidents.

It is not the purpose of this activity to apportion blame or liability."



Purpose of Safety Investigation

Regulation (EU) No 996/2010

Article 1: "This regulation aims to improve aviation safety by ensuring a high level of efficiency, expediency and quality of European civil aviation safety investigations, the sole objective of which is the prevention of future accidents and incidents without apportioning blame and liability, including through the establishment of a European Network of Civil Aviation Safety Investigation Authorities. (...)"



Means to Achieve this Purpose

Principle of neutrality

Independence of the Safety Investigation Authority (SIA)

From entities that could interfere with the conduct or objectivity of the investigation.

Separate from any judicial proceedings.



Means to Achieve this Purpose

Technical credibility

Consultation of entities able to provide useful information and technical support, through the States accredited representatives: operator, design, manufacturer...

The same entities have access to confidential information coming from the safety investigation to allow them to *implement safety actions* as needed.



Means to Achieve this Purpose Just culture principle

Protection of sensitive information flight recorders, witnesses, draft reports...

Dissemination of safety lessons

Safety investigations: Interactions with families?



"Whenever an air transportation related incident/accident/tragedy occurs victims' families are exposed to the immediate

Unwanted glare on their grief by public exposure - television and print press

Unceasing chatter and speculations on the internet as to the tragedies' causes, possibly due to malfeasance

Solicitations by self-appointed consultants

Some legal advisors promoting their services, directly and indirectly."

Difficulties with information to families

Confusion due to unvalidated information or rumors disseminated by media and social media + fake news.

Lack of understanding / familiarity with the safety investigation process and purpose & technical aspects.

SIA need to disseminate and explain, as soon as possible, validated information...but time needed to validate information, and analyse it.



Annex 13 Standard 5.27b

(...State of Victims) have access to the relevant factual information which is approved for public release, and information on the progress of the investigation.

Reg 996/2010 Article 15.5

Before making public the information referred to in paragraph 4, the safety investigation authority in charge shall forward that information to the victims and their relatives or their associations in a way which does not compromise the objectives of the safety investigation.



ENCASIA Actions to FacilitateInformation to Families

Sharing experience between members on dealing with social aspects of investigation and informing families.

Tutorial on informing families.

Information to families remains a responsibility of the SIA in charge of the investigation. ENCASIA cannot intervene in the investigations conducted by its members.
