

- The <u>State of Occurrence</u> of an aircraft accident and <u>adjacent State</u> shall facilitate:
- 1. temporary entry for family members of victims (Std. 8.41) &
- 2. authorized representatives of the aircraft operators (Std. 8.42)
- States should only require a passport, or an Emergency Travel Document, and, if required, expedite the issuance of entrance visas (RP. 8.43)
- States shall issue ETD to their nationals who have survived (Std. 8.44)
- States shall extend all necessary assistance in arranging customs clearance in repatriation of human remains (Std. 8.45)

Proposal for adoption by the Council

• States shall establish legislation, regulations, policies (*RP. 8.46* → Std.8.46)

Proposal Amendment 29 to Annex 9

• 8.46 Recommended Practice. — Contracting States should shall establish legislation, regulations and/or policies in support of assistance to aircraft accident victims (RP. 8.46 proposed as Std. 8.46)

Note.—Attention is drawn to Doc 9998, ICAO Policy on AAAVF and Doc 9973, Manual on AAAVF.

• 8.xx Recommended Practice.— Contracting States should ensure that each aircraft or airport operator, as appropriate, develop appropriate plans to provide timely and effective assistance to aircraft accident victims and their families. (New RP)

Note.—Airport operators plans regarding AAAVF may form part of the Aerodrome Emergency Plan (AEP) required under Annex 14 – Aerodromes.

Timelines (if adopted by the Council in Q1 2022):

Effective Date is July 2022 and the Applicable Date is November 2022

Focus on ICAO policy (Doc 9998)

States reaffirm their commitments to ensure that adequate and sufficient assistance is provided to aircraft accident victims and their families

For States establish legislation, regulations and/or policies addressing family assistance plans to ensure that family assistance providers the have necessary financial, personnel, and equipment resources, and that systems are available at short notice to provide assistance to aircraft accident victims and their families in a timely manner

For **Operators** require that air operators implement family assistance plans, and ensure that these plans are exercised regularly, supervised and audited as necessary


require that airport operators implement family assistance plans, which can be part of their Airport Emergency Plans, in coordination with air operators, and ensure that these plans are exercised regularly, supervised and audited as necessary;

Family assistance plan: Extracts from Doc 9998

A family assistance plan should consider the following factors



recipients of family assistance



types of family assistance to be provided



when family assistance should be provided



family assistance providers



periodic review and exercise of the plan



enactment of legislation, regulations and/or policies necessary to implement the plan.

HLCC 2021 Recommendations



Recommendation 10/1

States should:

- if they have not already done so, establish legislation, regulations and/or policies in support of assistance to aircraft accident victims and their families
- ensure that aircraft and airport operators develop appropriate plans to provide timely assistance to aircraft accident victims and their families, recognizing that airport operators' plans may form part of the aerodrome emergency plans required under Annex 14
