The East African Community (EAC)

A Regional Economic Cooperation – Burundi, Kenya, Rwanda, Tanzania and Uganda.

Established in November 1999 by the 3 founding States
- Kenya, Tanzania and Uganda

Rwanda and Burundi joined the EAC in July 2007



Co-operation in Infrastructure and Services – Civil Aviation

EAC Treaty – Chap. 15: Co-operation in Infrastructure and Services: Art.92 - Civil Aviation and Civil Air Transport

Art.92:Para. 1 -Development of appropriate aviation infrastructure...,

Art.92:Para. 3(e) - establishment of a unified upper area control system.

Art.92:Para. 3(h) - develop, maintain and co-ordinate in common, navigational facilities

East African Community Airport and Air Navigation Services Infrastructure Projects

1. East African Community Unified Flight Information Region (UFIR):

Objective: Creation of a single block of upper airspace to ensure excellent levels of safety and advantages in capacity , efficiency and performance over the present scheme.

Estimated cost: US\$25,850,000



East African Community Airport and Air Navigation Services Infrastructure Projects

2. Priority Airports Project

Objective: Enhance accessibility, operations and safety to facilitate tourism growth .

Estimated cost: US\$ 141,688,563

Challenges in Attracting Capital for Airport and Air Navigation Services Infrastructure Projects in EAC

- Regional and individual Partner States priorities
- Lack of capacity to develop bankable projects
- Priority of aviation projects against other social sector projects
- Difficulties to raise private funds
- Under developed private sector participation (PPI)
- The EAC structure and capacity

Way Forward

- Development of a framework for private sector participation
- Partner States budgets to factor in priority funding of the infrastructure projects following the development of the investment profiles for priority projects
- Alignment of individual Partner States to regional priorities
- Enhance competitiveness of the air transport – operation costs
