The pillars of administrative & operational capacity

Vital importance of all 3 capacity components



All three must be integrated and balanced!

- 1. Infrastructure and capital assets
- 2. Competent human resources
- 3. Regulatory and institutional framework

Three levels of capacity: integrated border management

- Sufficient capacity of each relevant government agency
- 2. Inter-agency cooperation: data sharing and concerted action
- 3. Cross-border cooperation: data sharing and joint operations

Capacity building: definitions



strengthen the knowledge, abilities, skills and behavior of individuals and improve institutional structures and processes such that the organization can efficiently meet its mission and goals in a sustainable way

Activities which



manner.

Capacity refers to the ability of individuals D P and institutions to make and implement decisions and perform functions in an effective, efficient and sustainable

[CB] focuses on the overall organizational performance and functioning capabilities, as well as the ability of an organization to adapt to change.

Stakeholders: inter-agency cooperation & information sharing in MRTD and border controls

- Consular Department of the MFA

Secondary stakeholders

- National Criminal Intelligence Agency
- Airport Authority
- Ministry of Tourism
- Quarantine / Public Health
- National Security Intelligence Agency
- Ministry of Justice
- Other law enforcement agencies
- International Organisations
- Non-govt partners: airlines, relevant NGOs, think-tanks

Importance of inter-agency & cross-border cooperation

- Combating document fraud, illegal migration, trans-border crime and terrorism ----
- Are multi-agency and trans-border in nature: cannot be handled effectively by a single agency or unilaterally
- Require inter-agency and cross-border cooperation and data sharing
- A global problem, not limited to specific regions
- 9/11: an "eye-opener"

Constraints

- Lack of trust and tradition of cooperation
- Lack of regulatory framework
- Lack of a secure communications and data sharing platform

Solutions:

- "Salami tactics"
- Joint informal meetings and conferences
- Joint training
- Sharing best practices of information exchange as case studies
- Long term goals: ongoing information sharing, concerted action, joint enforcement operations, harmonising policies on a regional level.

2. Capacity-building project cycle

- Identifying issues, challenges and problems
- Needs assessment: identifying capacity gaps
- Formulating TC projects or programmes
- Scanning donor priorities, to mach beneficiary countries' needs
- Securing donor funding and launching the project
- Implementing the project, enhancing capacity and eliminating original weaknesses
- Using lessons learnt for further programme development

3. Remaining capacity gaps: MRTD and border controls

- 1. No MRPs (1 APR 2010 deadline)
- 2. ICAO non-compliant MRPs
- 3. EoI and civil registries
- 4. MRPs but no passport readers: manual processing
- Flaws in passport-issuing processes
- Lack of vocational training and technical knowledge

Also: lesser areas – often overlooked - but still important

- Service passports
- Diplomatic passports
- Emergency passports / one-way return documents
- UN Convention travel docs
 - Refugee travel doc
 - Stateless person travel doc (Certificate of Identity)
- Visas and ID cards
- Bilateral border-crossing passes

4. ICAO/TAG ICBWG: technical assistance to States

- Implementation and Capacity Building Working Group
- Established in May 2008
- Assists the ICAO Secretariat in:
 - Developing and implementing projects in MRTDrelated areas
 - Providing capacity-building outreach activities and technical consultations
 - Developing guidance materials and training courses
