Why have an assessment?

Reasons can include:

- As part of an overall border and travel document assessment
- As part of a process to obtain visa relaxation
- As part of a scoping study

In-house or Independent Assessment?

In-house drawbacks:

- Degree of experience of assessor
- Bias
- Level of assurance required

Preparation for an Assessment

- Selection of assessor
- Background papers
- Agenda for visit & time issues

The Assessment Process

- Government commitment
- Carrying out the assessment
- Using the ICAO Assessment tool
- Site Visits

Assessment Report

- Timing
- Content

- Report should not only highlight weaknesses but offer possible solutions
