- **Established in 1952 as Customs Cooperation Council (CCC)**
- **Headquarters in Brussels, Belgium**
- **179 members (as of July 2014)**
- **Responsible for processing 98% of global trade**

➤ **2010 – SAFE Package**



# SAFE Framework ( 4 Core Elements)

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Harmonize the advance electronic information requirement on inbound, outbound and transit shipments.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Commit to employing a consistent risk management approach to address security threats.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Outbound inspection of high risk consignments being exported, preferably using non-intrusive inspection methods.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Customs will provide benefits to businesses that meet minimal supply chain security standards and best practices.</li></ul>

# SAFE Framework ( 2 Pillars)

- Pillar 1 = Customs to Customs
- Pillar 2 = Customs to Business

*Standards were drawn from the existing WCO Security and facilitation measures and programs*

(BENEFITS of 2-pillar strategy)

- Consolidate standards for easy understanding
- Rapid international implementation



# WCO's work on Air Cargo Security

- October 2010 - Yemen incident
- December 2010 - WCO Policy Commission – Communiqué
- February 2011 – **T**echnical **E**xperts **G**roup on **A**ir **C**argo **S**ecurity (“**TEGACS**”) was formed to promote synergies with WCO, ICAO and UPU's instruments, tools and programs
  - ✓ Examine commonalities and differences between aviation and Customs approaches and find complementarity to each other
  - ✓ Aims at harmonization and cross-border recognition of AEO/KC
  - ✓ Explore best utilization of advance electronic information



# “TEGACS” and SAFE Framework

- Advance cargo information – data elements, time limits
- Harmonization of ICAO & WCO security regimes  
- i.e. Regulated Agent/Known Consignor & AEO
- To ensure processes are harmonized to the extent possible
- Roles & responsibilities of the stakeholders
- To ensure no gaps between the efforts of the groups involved
- To **avoid any unnecessary burden on trade**

# Joint Conference on Enhancing Air cargo Security and Facilitation

**1st Conference in July 2012 in Singapore**

more than 350 delegates from over 40 countries

**Joint Communiqué** ~ Synergy through cooperation~

- Need for cooperation at international and state levels between competent authorities
- Reinforced principle of security control at **the point of origin**
- Use of **electronic** cargo information to support risk management
- Promote **capacity building** to support implementation of air cargo **security and facilitation** measures



# Joint Conference on Enhancing Air cargo Security and Facilitation

## 2nd Conference in April 2014 in Bahrain

Over 300 participants representing 42 states, 50 international /regional organizations and industry

### Joint Communiqué

~ Collaborative Solution for Future Challenges~

- Coordinated implementation of risk-based, outcomes-focused air cargo and mail security measures
- Air cargo and security measures and initiatives from a facilitation perspective for sustainable implementation
- Promotion of joint validation of entities, technical assistance, capacity building and training of supply chain personnel

## 2nd Conference in April 2014 in Bahrain

(Work accomplished by ICAO and WCO)

- ◆ Development of a Joint **Training Module**
- ◆ Development of Joint **AEO/Regulated Agency (RA) Pilot Program**
- ◆ Creation of a Joint **Working Group on Advance Cargo Information**



# Way Forward




# SAFE Framework Review Process 2015

- ✓ Review every 3 years to maintain Standards are relevant to countering threats
- ✓ SAFE Review Sub-Group discussing various proposals
- ✓ Incorporation of **Pillar 3** (Cooperation between Customs and other Governmental Agencies)
- ✓ Linkages to Conventions and other instruments of ICAO and UPU in the Pillar 3 of SAFE Framework
- ✓ A drafting group is working on the texts to be incorporated, including the **use of “pre-loading Advance Cargo Information”**



# ICAO – WCO Collaboration

- ✓ Good balance between security and facilitation
- ✓ Further promotion of AEO and Mutual Recognition of the respective AEO Programs
- ✓ Harmonization of AEO and RA/KC
- ✓ Greater focus on capacity building
  - ➔ *Joint Workshop in mid-December 2014 in Bangkok to exercise **Joint Training Module***
- ✓ Joint Working Group on Advance Cargo Information (**“7+1” data elements**)
- ✓ Joint Security Pilot Program, etc.
