



Global Infrastructure Investment Needs are Staggering



By 2040 \$94T in infrastructure investment needed to achieve Sustainable Development Goals

AIRPORTS



\$2.1 Trillion, current trajectory

\$2.7 Trillion, needed

GAP: \$530 Billion

Limited government budgets and ODA assistance mean crowding in private investment...

PPPs, one way to surmount these infrastructure investment needs











Definition: A **long-term contract** between a **private party and a government entity**, for providing a public asset or service, in which the **private party bears significant risk** and management responsibility and remuneration is linked to performance.


Innovation; better risk management













Looking at gender from a PPP & infrastructure (P) DDD A F vantage point was daunting


What we learned and what could be applicable to other partnerships
