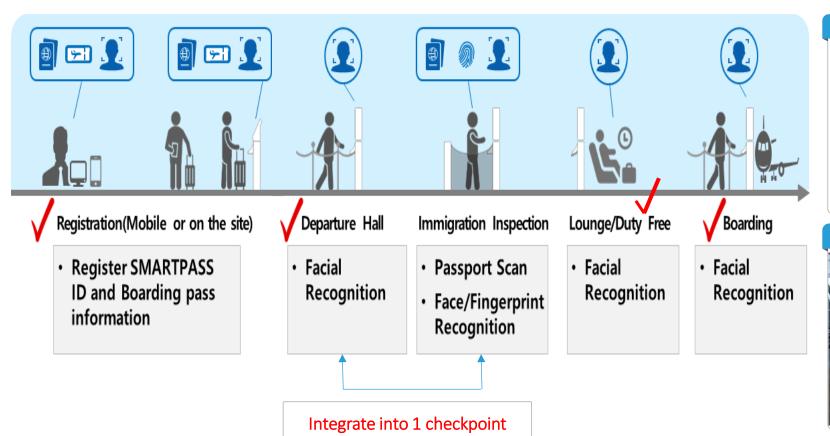


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Smart Pass: Seamless Travel based on Biometrics (Facial Recognition)

Overview of current Smart Pass





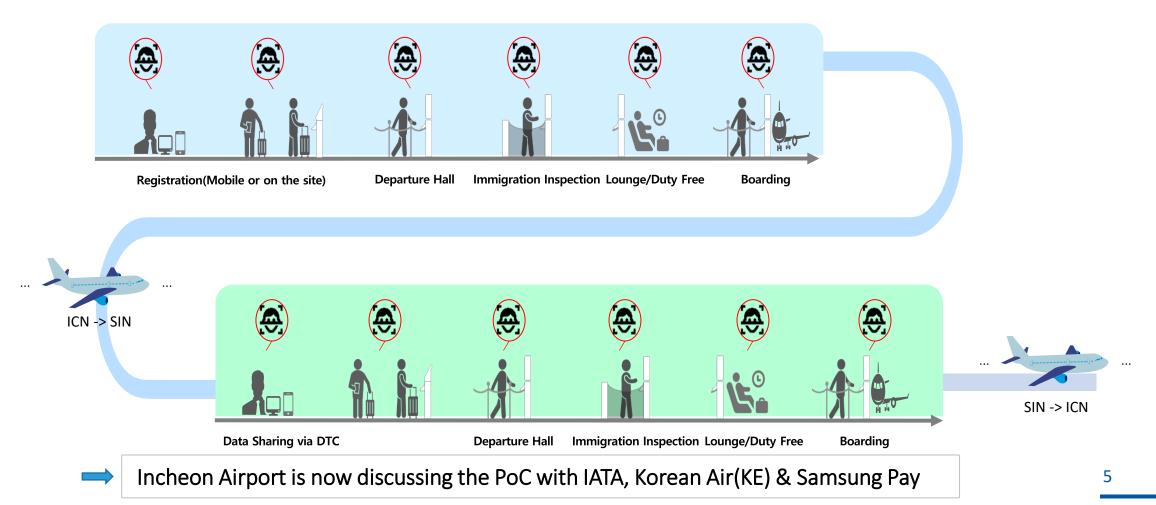


Lesson Learned

- ✓ Collaboration between Airport authority and Stakeholders(Immigration, Airlines) is a key barrier to progress in digital identity.
- ✓ Immigration Bureau is worried about the misuse of biometric identification by 3rd party & lower level of security standard in 3rd party(vendor, etc.). → Related to Cyber Security
- ✓ Compliance with international and national regulations could be the obstacles for adopting the contactless journey.
 - ex) Foreign carriers misunderstood that Smart Pass might violate the GDPR(privacy issue).
 - According to the national regulation, Immigration Bureau shall check if the pax holds the valid passport.
- ✓ Failure of standardization in biometric identification methods(Facial, Finger Print, Palm Vein) of Korea caused difficulty in integrating the digital identity and adopting the seamless travel.
- ✓ Pax needs to be convinced of safety and security of biometric technology in order to widely use it. → Related to Cyber Security

Future: Expansion of Smart Pass via DTC or One ID

Overview of Expanded Smart Pass



Factors to be considered

- ✓ Clear standard to expand the contactless journey(digital travel)
 ex) ICAO DTC, IATA One ID
- ✓ Interoperability among stakeholders(Government, Airport, Airline, Vendor, etc.) is vital.
- ✓ Different security level or standard among stakeholders may cause cyber security issue.
 ex) physical / technical / managerial security level or standard
- ✓ Compliance with international and national regulations
