





INTERPOL's Rules on the Processing of Data (RPD)

Key Elements (RPD)

- INTERPOL owns the database;
- Property: the data remains property of Member Countries (right to monitoring the use of the data);
- Quality/Compliance: INTERPOL performs data quality and compliance checks and not compliant data is placed off-line;
- Restrictions: data owners can restrict access to their data by countries they do not want to share information with.



INTERPOL's National Central Bureau

Setting up of a national PIU

- Access to INTERPOL databases other than Nominals and SLTD to better support analysis
- Facilitate global cooperation with national agencies
- Continuously foster timely and accurately update of INTERPOL databases
