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Challenges with European border management

- No reliable information on who comes to the Schengen area
- ... and when they leave
- No reliable way to identify overstayers
- Result: security gap

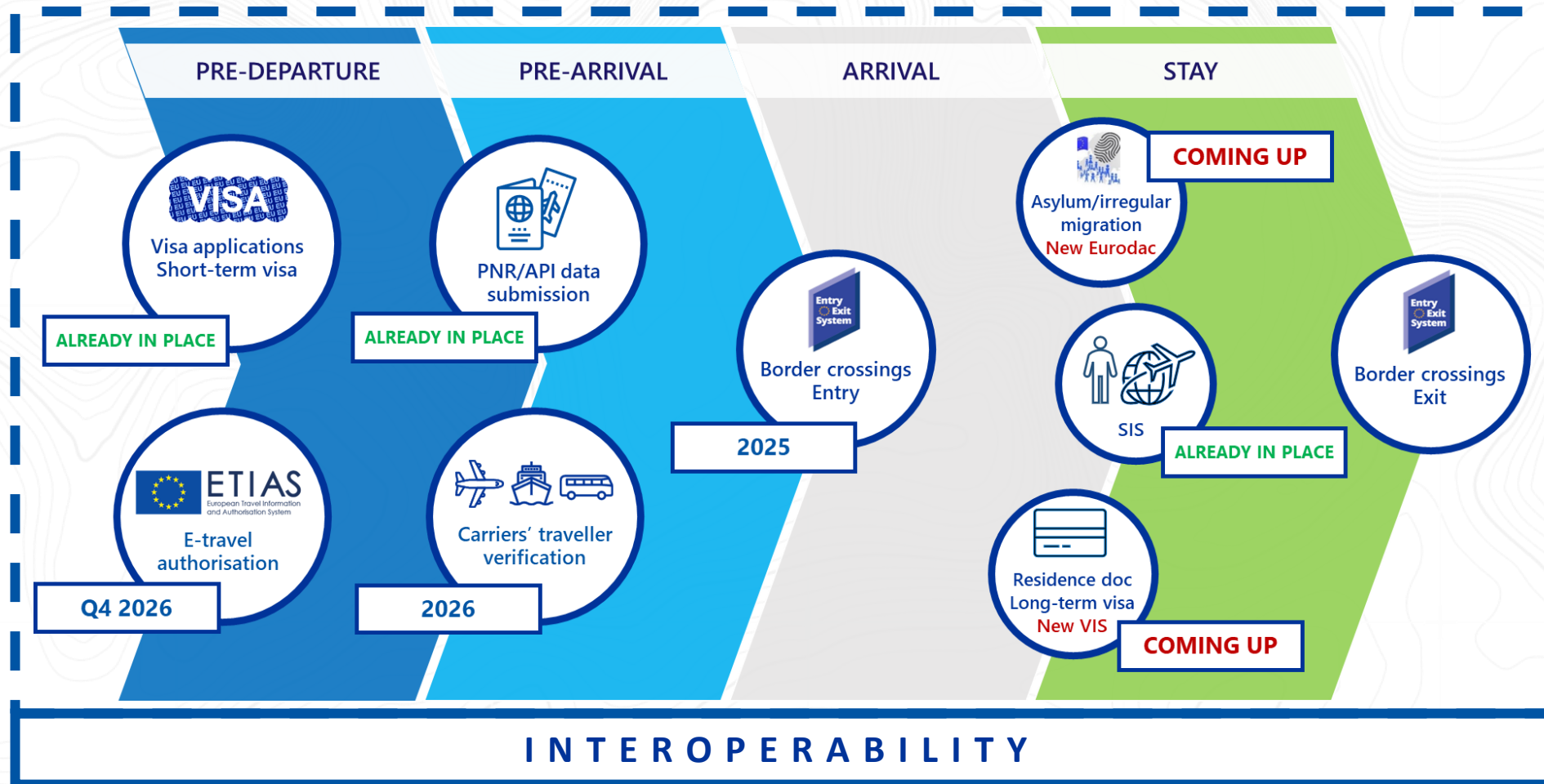
- Making these systems talk to each other

European Travel Information and Authorisation System (ETIAS)

- Established by the Regulation (EU) 2018/1240, hosted by Frontex
- Strengthens Europe's internal security while facilitating the movement of *bona fide* travellers
- 4 EU institutions and 30 European countries involved
- Entry into operation (Q4 2026*)
 - * Dates is indicative - to be confirmed by the Commission and/or legislator



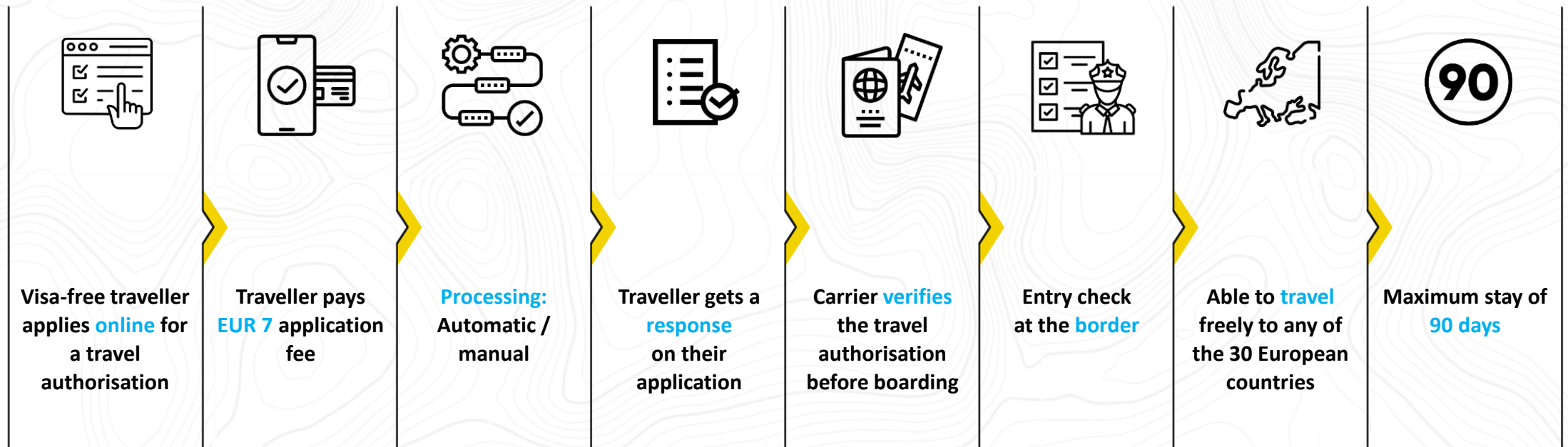

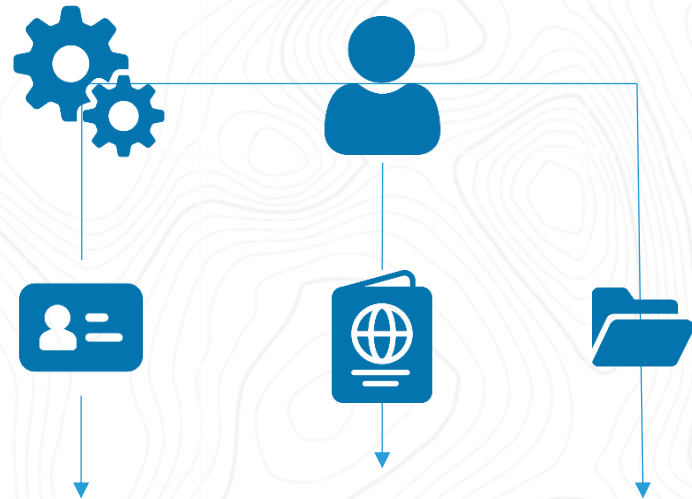

How it will work



Processing applications

- In most cases (about 95%), applications will be **processed within minutes**, but it could take up to **30 days**



Checks against databases
(SIS/VIS/EUROPOL/EURODAC/ etc.)
+ ETIAS including screening rules
and watchlist



If there is a hit during the automated processing, the application will be manually handled by an operator of the ETIAS Central Unit and the ETIAS National Unit



Risk screening

- Applicants screened against security, public health, and illegal immigration risks
- ETIAS Central Unit identifies and maintains risks, risk indicators and screening rules on European level – will be extended to VIS as well
- Consultation with the ETIAS Screening Board and the ETIAS Fundamental Rights Guidance Board



Data protection and management

- Applicants provide sensitive personal data
- Applicants can submit data subject requests via the ETIAS website
- ETIAS Central Unit:
 - handles data subject requests
 - ensures the data is accurate and up to date
 - acts as data controller



Carriers

- New obligations for air, sea and coach carriers
- Electronic verification of travellers
 - New tool: carrier interface
- ETIAS Central Unit provides 24/7 support to carriers on the Entry/Exit System and ETIAS in English
- Management of FAQ for carriers



Travel to Europe mobile app

- **A mobile app for EES pre-registration**
 - Collects passport data, facial image, answers to the entry questionnaire
- **Voluntary for Member States and travellers**
- **The ETIAS Central Unit:**
 - Developed and manages the app
 - Provides support to Member States and travellers
