Our shared progress comes from collaboration. This is why we value ICAO's 'No Country Left Behind' strategic goal, which underscores the importance of helping all states benefit from our global aviation system.

This event builds on the achievements of the 2024 ICAO Year of Facilitation, which heightened awareness and fostered stronger ties among States and stakeholders regarding the importance of facilitation.
