As ICAO projects more than a two-fold increase in passenger and cargo traffic, we are committed to collaborating with all stakeholders to uphold standards while advancing the adoption of technologies and innovative solutions to enhance the experience of aviation users.

In line with ICAO provisions, Rwanda has implemented the ICAO Traveler Identification Programme. In 2020, Rwanda joined ICAO PKD. Currently, all travel documents issued are e-MRTDs. This has greatly supported the implementation of an interactive API in Rwanda and the progressive implementation of Passenger Name Record (PNR). The continued collaboration of all States will be important in realizing the ICAO provisions on Passenger Data Exchange, especially concerning PNR.

Additionally, in an effort to promote seamless travel, in 2019, Rwanda started issuing visas on arrival for all States, with over 86 States not requiring any visas. To further enhance passengers' experience with regard to airport processes, Kigali International Airport is progressively implementing Automated Border Control and self-check-in kiosks.

The lessons learned from COVID-19 highlighted the effectiveness of various cooperation mechanisms, such as the National Air Transport Facilitation Committee and the National Aviation Security Committee. These committees have streamlined cooperation, collaboration, and decision-making among state agencies responsible for security and facilitation. Through this inter-agency collaboration, several solutions were quickly implemented to enable seamless travel. As discussed during the conference panels, we continue to learn and evolve these mechanisms to improve the experiences for both passengers and cargo.

We shall continue to advocate and support the use of technological solutions towards ensuring a better experience for the traveling public. Starting with the various initiatives by ICAO, States and the industry have a critical part to play in making the needed transformation a reality.
