We therefore invite governments, international financial institutions, and private sector investors to partner with us in realizing this transformative project, which promises to catalyze economic growth, enhance trade, boost tourism, and create meaningful employment opportunities.

In conclusion, Somalia reaffirms its **unwavering commitment to ICAO's principles** and the **No Country Left Behind (NCLB)** initiative. We firmly believe that enhanced regional collaboration, continued capacity development, and inclusive partnerships are essential to building a safer, more connected, and more resilient global aviation system.
