Annex 9 - Facilitation requires States to implement Advance Passenger Information (API) and Passenger Name Record (PNR) data systems, both of which involve transfer of data from travel documents and aviation systems from carriers to governmental authorities. These passenger data exchange systems are considered vital in combating transnational criminality, necessitating consideration of their effective implementation. Data quality is also important, implying verification of data using tools like ICAO's Public Key Directory (PKD). The session will explore how sharing and analyzing trustworthy and high-quality passenger data, along with digitalization and innovation technologies, can further improve the passenger experience and enhance the fight against cross-border crime. Best practices for effective implementation will also be shared.
