2178 (2014)

- Definition of Foreign Terrorist Fighters (FTFs)
- Obligation to provide Advance Passenger Information (API)
- Information sharing



2396 (2017)

- Obligation to provide API and Passenger Name Record (PNR) data
- Information sharing and FTF-related watchlists and monitoring
- Collaborative work of UN bodies



2482 (2019)

- Nexus between terrorism and organised crime
- Use of INTERPOL databases

Key concepts



The information given by passengers as they travel across the world's transport infrastructures can form a powerful tool for national competent authorities to prevent, detect and prosecute terrorists and serious criminals, in compliance with international human rights law.

Passenger information

- **Advance Passenger Information** - the capture of a passenger's or crew member's biographic data and flight details by the aircraft operator prior to departure.
- **Passenger Name Record** – booking information.

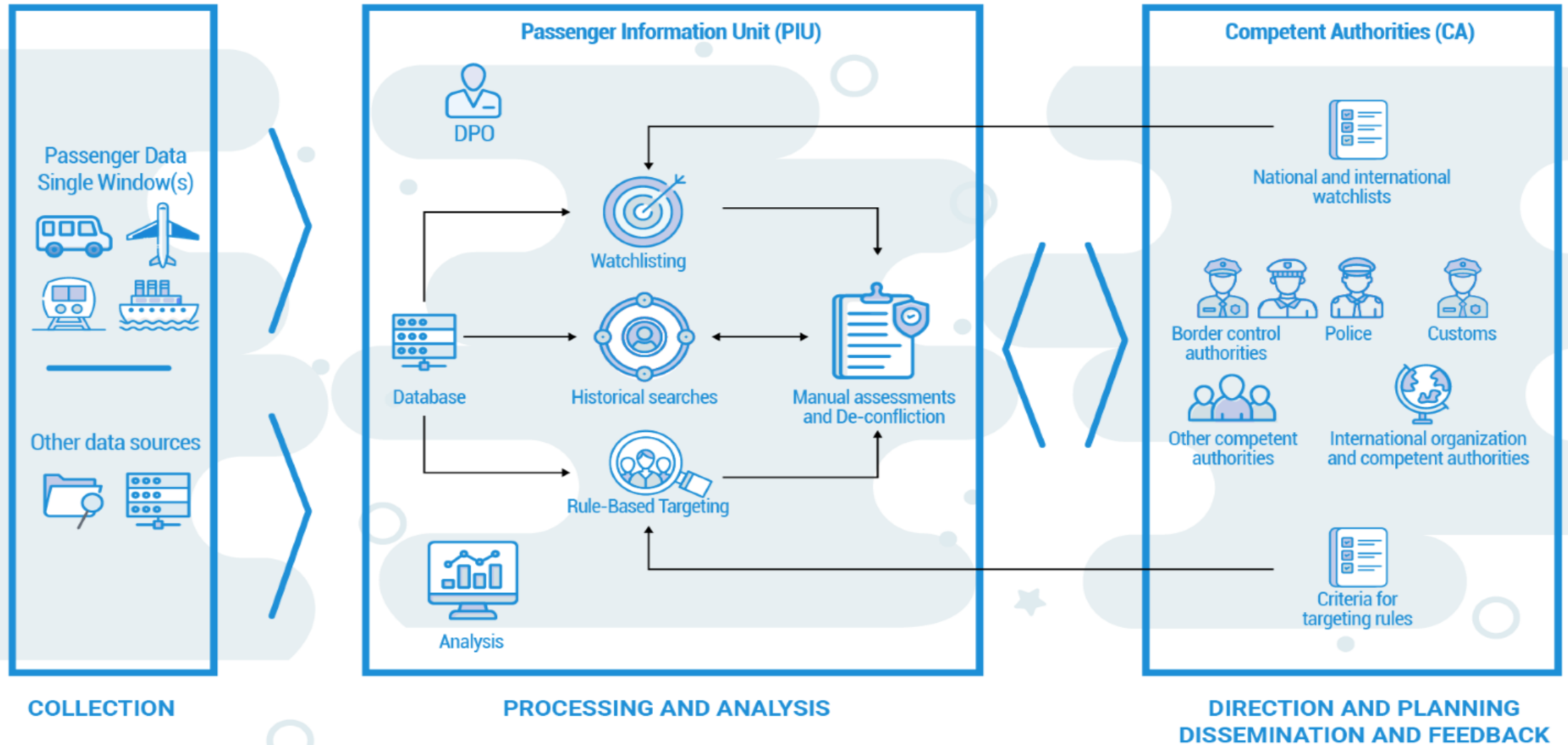

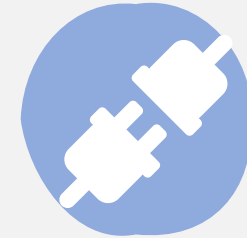
