








PURPOSE AND BENEFITS


The STLD database can be accessed by National Central Bureaus (NCBs) and other authorized users – such as officers at border control, immigration and customs – in order to instantly verify if a person is attempting to enter/leave the country by using a travel document fraudulently.

This process directly assists law enforcement authorities in identifying the misuse of travel documents in order to prevent criminals from:

- crossing international borders,
- concealing their true identities,
- carrying out criminal acts by means of stolen or falsified travel documents.







- Integrate Fixed INTERPOL Network Database (FIND) web service into national border management systems.
- Implement WISDM SLTD to automatically populate INTERPOL databases from national databases of member countries.
- Inter-Agency SOP for reporting and recording stolen and lost travel documents, and responding to SLTD search HITs.
