Facilitation is a multi-stakeholder effort – NATFC can be leveraged on **beyond compliance to Annex 9**

- Alignment from multiple entities across various areas is challenging.
- Need to establish an effective platform that is engaging, relevant and collaborative.

ICAO Annex 9, Standards 8.15 –

*Each State **shall establish a National Air Transport Facilitation Committee (NATFC)**, and Airport Facilitation Committee as required, for the **purpose of coordinating facilitation activities** between departments, agencies, and other organizations of the State concerned with, or responsible for, various aspects of international civil aviation as well as with airport and aircraft operators.*

- But is NATFC just about compliance to Annex 9?
- Singapore has reaped significant benefits from the set up of NATFC since 2012 to optimise the ecosystem.

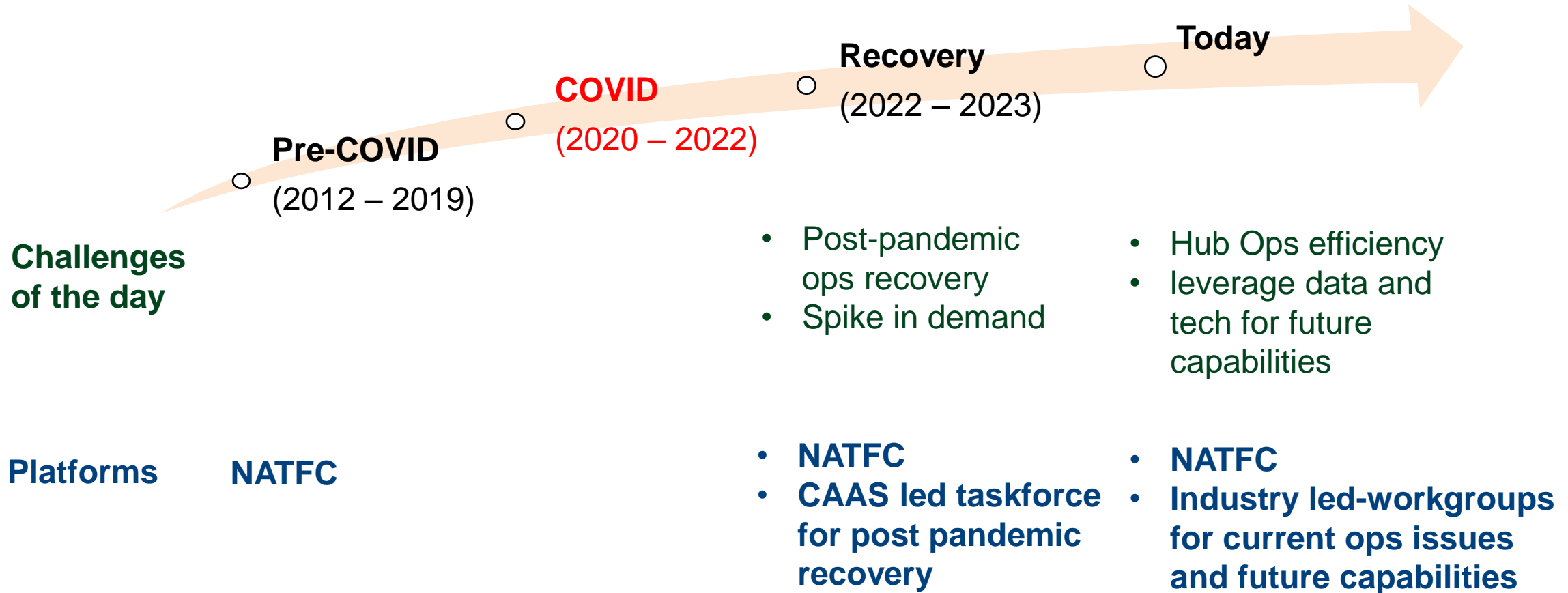
