





Global Efforts in the Air Transport Liberalization

1. Chicago Convention

Preamble

THEREFORE, the undersigned governments having agreed on certain principles and arrangements in order that international civil aviation may be developed in a safe and orderly manner and that international air transport services may be established on the basis of equality of opportunity and operated soundly and economically;

Article 44

....insure that the rights of contracting States are fully respected and that every contracting State has a fair opportunity to operate international airlines;



ICAO's Efforts in the Air Cargo Liberalization

1. ICAO ATConf/6

"the Conference concluded that:

d) there is broad support for ICAO to play a leadership role in facilitating further liberalization, and some support for ICAO to develop a multilateral agreement specifically focused on air cargo..."

2. ICAO A38

Requested the Council, inter alia, "to develop and adopt a long-term vision for international air transport liberalization"

3. ICAO A39 Resolution:

"Requests the Council ... continue the development of a specific international agreement to facilitate further liberalization of air cargo services, taking into account the goals of the ICAO long-term vision for international air transport liberalization, and the past experience and achievements of States, including existing market access liberalization agreements concluded at bilateral, regional and multilateral levels, as well as the various proposals presented during the Sixth Worldwide Air Transport Conference (ATConf/6);"

4. ATRP/14 Yellow Cover Report:

"The Panel agreed to develop a specific protocol to facilitate further liberalization of air cargo services, covering up to 7th Freedom Traffic Rights."





Qatar – Strong Supporter of Air Cargo Liberalization

Qatar's Working Paper to the ICAO 39th Assembly

(A39-WP/173 EC/19 9/8/16)

"The purpose of the multilateral agreement should include ... up to 7th freedom traffic rights for all-cargo services..."

Qatar has fully liberalized air cargo transport with 105 countries. (unlimited and unrestricted 3rd, 4th and 5th freedom traffic rights)





Maximizing the Benefits in a Liberalization Environment - Qatar Airways Experience in Europe

Cargo Flows from the Restricted Hub to the Liberalized Ones

Germany - restricted by 7 weekly freq.

Belgium - restricted by 28 weekly freq.

Luxembourg - unrestricted access

 Due to the traffic rights restrictions, cargo is consolidated at LUX, from where the cargo heads to the restricted European destinations by road transportation.

For example: 27.4% of the cargo carried by QR from FRA and 12.5% of the cargo carried by QR to FRA are via LUX.






Frankfurt Airport annual system cargo payload (kg) capacity

Liege Airport annual system cargo payload (kg) capacity





A Fully Liberalized Market - Qatar Airways' Experience in the USA

Benefits of Liberalization:

- 11 American cities
- 7 cities served with freighters)
- approximately 206,680 tons of cargo in the last 12 months to/fr USA by QR.



The Case of Pittsburgh:

- QR Cargo is the only foreign all-cargo carrier operating to Pittsburgh (3 weekly connecting PIT to DOH, LGG and LUX).
- QR has operated 92 all cargo flights to PIT since its inaugural flight in October 2017.
- However, Liberalization barriers occur with certain 5th freedom arrangements, particularly to points in China.



A Restricted Market with Big Demand - Qatar Airways' Experience in China



- 103,163 tons of cargo to/from China in the last 12 months through by QR.
- Restricted by 7 weekly freq. for all-cargo services
- Due to the lack of traffic rights, 13 charter flights to Zhengzhou since 2016.



Cargo-XML transition

QR cargo is among the first carriers worldwide with capability to process cargo XML standard of messaging in its core cargo system, leading the IATA initiative to transition from C-IMP to C-XML.
