Air Cargo is Inherently Multimodal

Almost every cargo shipment begins and ends with a truck







Moving air freight may require up to 20 different documents and 7 or more companies to complete the movement from shipper to consignee

Air Cargo Carriers:

- Airport to Airport Air Carriers
 - ► Belly Cargo Carriers: Finn Air (AY), Delta (DL), United (UA), etc.
 - ► Pax Belly Cargo & Freighter Operators: Korean Air (KE), Air China (CA), EVA (BR), etc.

 Suparna (Y8), Cargolux (CV), Polar Air Cargo (PO), etc.
- Integrator/Express Air Carriers











The Air Cargo Supply Chain is a Complicated Process



Complex Interfaces Need to be Simplified



Emerging Issues

- An increasingly complex supply chain with many players.
- Changing trend of end-to-end service in air cargo.
- How air cargo connects with other modes of transport and how the cargo supply chain could be improved through more efficient and effective intermodal transport system
- Cross border e-commerce: how to effectively deal with Customs and increased regulation and security compliance requirements.
- The fast growing B2C market requiring last mile to the door delivery.
- The lack of understanding of the role trucks play in the air cargo supply chain resulting in congested terminal facilities, security issues and congested surface streets.
- Lack of data reporting mechanisms for air trucking. Volume of air cargo traveling truck-to-truck is unknown, cargo flows between airports by truck is unreported and number of trucks on airport is unknown.
