Major transformations in higher education


- Increased "internationalization" and student mobility

Relevance of education

- Academia should consult State aviation growth projections and industry HR plans.
- Curricula should be designed based on State aviation plans.
- Industry provides competencies and qualifications required to meet aviation needs.

Innovations for greater accessibility


- Academia should integrate new technologies and delivery methods based on industry best practices (i.e Online Distance Learning, Massive/Hybrid Open Online Courses etc.)
- Industry should sponsor technology/tools to support accessibility.
- States should recognize innovative academic programmes.

Affordability

- Encouraging work/study programmes between Academia and Industry/States.
- On the job apprenticeships with Industry/States.

 Innovative scholarship programmes involving industry (as part of talent acquisition strategies).
