Top 10 Reasons to Develop an Action Plan

- better understanding of the share and projections of international aviation
 CO₂ emissions;
- 2. enhanced **cooperation** between all aviation stakeholders that can positively reflect on their operational areas;
- identification of the most relevant mitigation actions;
- 4. **coherent** and **integrated** policies;
- 5. enhancing stakeholders' support and understanding for policy decisions;
- establishment of cross-sectoral partnerships;
- 7. promotion of capacity building;
- 8. multiplication of the environmental effects of mitigation measures;
- 9. facilitation of technology transfer; and
- 10. identification of assistance needs.

1 – Better understanding of the share and projections of international aviation CO₂ emissions

 Provides insight into your State's international aviation sector vs. the domestic aviation sector

- 2 Enhanced cooperation between all aviation stakeholders that can positively reflect on their operational areas
- Provides an opportunity to bring multiple stakeholders around the table
 - Opens and maintains the communications channels between multiple players in the industry
- If your aviation industry already does this, the Action Plan can be added as a new topic of discussion
- Avoids duplication of work

3 – Identification of the most **relevant** mitigation actions

- Mitigation measures should be selected on the specific needs of your State's aviation industry
 - Communication will allow for the appropriate measures to be chosen based on that context
 - What is possible to implement
 - When goals can be met
 - Whether the expectations are realistic

4 – Coherent and integrated policies

- Allows for coherent policies to be implemented
 - Integrate with other related policies
 - Departments of Transportation
 - Department of Energy
 - Department of Environment

5 – Enhancing stakeholders' support and understanding for policy decisions

- Ensures that stakeholders have a say in the adoption of policies that will impact them
- Ensures that the policies are coherent with the needs of stakeholders

6 – Establishment of cross-sectoral partnerships

 The combined knowledge of various stakeholders can lead to a more valuable experience and outcome for all involved

7 – Promotion of capacity building

- Understanding the challenges of others
- Working together to overcome those challenges

8 – Multiplication of the **environmental effects** of mitigation measures

 The more stakeholders that are involved in the implementation of mitigation measures, the more widespread the impacts will be for the State

9 – Facilitation of **technology transfer**

 The transmission of skills, knowledge and technologies

10 – identification of assistance needs

 Provides a clear way to express your needs in order to reach the determined goals

Action Plan Advantages to States

- Action plans give ICAO Member States the ability to:
 - establish partnerships
 - promote cooperation and capacity building
 - facilitate technology transfer
 - obtain assistance
- They provide an organized means for the State to
 - report international aviation CO₂ emissions to ICAO
 - outline their respective policies and actions
 - provide information on the basket of measures considered, reflecting their respective national capacities and circumstances, and on any specific assistance needs

- 1 Contact information
 - Baseline (without action) fuel consumption CO₂ emissions and traffic (2010 or earlier to 2050)
 - 3 List of selected measures
 - Expected results (fuel consumption, CO₂ emissions and traffic with the actions in #3 being taken 2017 to 2050)
 - 5 Assistance needs

Assembly Resolution A39 required ICAO Council

Facilitate access to existing and new financial resources, technology transfer, and capacity building for developing countries

Build further partnerships with other international organizations to meet the assistance needs of ICAO's member States, including through the ICAO Action Plan Buddy Programme

Encourage synergies and constructive engagement among ICAO Member States, stakeholders and other international organizations to actively participate in exchange of information and best practices and facilitate the establishment of partnerships

Continue providing assistance to its member States through the dissemination of the latest information on best practices and the provision of guidance and other technical assistance to enhance capacity building and technology



ICAO Assistance

Since the 37th Session of the ICAO Assembly in 2010, ICAO has developed an **integrated and comprehensive strategy** to support States willing to take action to reduce CO2 emissions from international aviation.

Important elements of this strategy include to **facilitate access to financial resources** to enable the development of action plans and /or the implementation of measures to reduce CO2 emissions, **build partnerships**, develop guidance documents, technical material, and capacity building activities.

ICAO Buddy Programme

ICAO has developed a draft agreement of cooperation aiming to establish a model framework by which ICAO Member States can help other Member State(s) to prepare and submit their States' Action Plan. It aims to facilitate the development of international cooperation among ICAO Member States, in which one State – the Buddy that has already submitted its States' Action Plan, assists another State.

ICAO States' Action Plans are an essential tool to define and implement States' actions to reduce CO₂ emissions from international aviation. Additionally, it is a valuable instrument for ICAO to measure the achievements made by States regarding the global aspirational goals to reduce international aviation emissions. In spite of the progress already made by some States, many still need assistance to elaborate and submit their action plans. Aligned with the ICAO Assembly Resolution A38-18 Paragraph 13, this Buddy Agreement is created to facilitate the establishment of partnerships between ICAO's Member States in order to assist each other to this end.

This Buddy agreement is made between ICAO Member State A, and ICAO Member State B collectively referred to as Buddy Partners. It is a non-legally binding collaboration to be implemented in good faith

ICAO – EU Partnership

In 2013, ICAO established the first partnership to develop and implement action plans with the European Union: a joint assistance project on capacity building for CO2 mitigation from international aviation in 14 selected States, 12 of them from the African region and two from the Caribbean region.

Main objectives:

- support the development of voluntary action plans;
- set-up Aviation Environmental Systems
- implement measures to reduce aviation emissions.



ICAO Partnerships

ICAO-UNDP-GEF Global Capacity-Building Project

Partnership was also established with the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) with financing from the Global Environment Facility (GEF) to undertake a **Global Capacity Building project** – including the implementation of a pilot project on renewable energy in a Small Island Developing State that can be **replicable** in other SIDs.

In addition this project has the objective to facilitate access to GEF national allocation – upcoming *ICAO Guidance document on Financing Airport Carbon Emissions Projects*.

Identification of low emissions aviation measures in Developing States

and SIDS

Supporting developing States and SIDS to strenghten their national capacities and improve their national processes and mecahnisms for the reduction of aviation emissions

Estaiblishment of a technical support platetform for the implementation of low emissions measures

Demonstration of low emissions aviation measures

More developing States and SIDs identify low emissions measures that feasible for them

Instruments are made available to support the development of a legal and regulatory environment that facilitates States in the financing of feasible low emissions mitigation measures The cost and resources expended by ICAO developing States and SIDS to have access to updated technical information on low emission mitigation measures is greatly minimized

The feasibility of implementation low emissions aviation measures is demonstrated through the pilot project and lessons learnt are made available to facilitate the replication in developing States and SIDs

Development of a guidance document on the costs and environmental benefits of the basket of measures indicated in the ICAO Doc 9988 Development of 4 Guidance documents to promote low emissions aviation in Developing States and SIDs Establishment of technical support platform to support the implementation of low emission measures in the aviation sector

Next Steps:

ACI – ICAO and ACI signed an MOU for providing a framework for enhanced cooperation regarding environmental related initiatives

European Union - ICAO and the EU signed a Declaration of Intent renewing their partnership to address climate change

ICAO continue to explore potential cooperation with other International Organizations and United Nations Agencies:

Green Climate Fund

The GCF is providing support to developing countries to limit or reduce their greenhouse gas emissions and to adapt to the impacts of climate change, taking into account the needs of those developing countries particularly vulnerable to the adverse effects of climate change

Regional Development Banks (AfDB, IDB, etc.)
