12. About Antigua Guatemala

The city of Antigua Guatemala serves as the <u>seat of government</u> for the <u>municipality of the same name</u> and is the capital of the department of Sacatepéquez. It is located approximately 45 km west of the <u>capital of the Republic of Guatemala</u> and is at an <u>altitude</u> of 1,470 metres above sea level.

Antigua Guatemala was named a World Heritage site by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) in 1979.

Its well-preserved buildings, which combine Spanish Baroque architecture with New World Baroque façades, make the city a major destination for Guatemalan tourism. In addition, Antigua Guatemala is home to the ruins of many centuries-old Catholic churches which sustained severe structural damage caused both by the neglect they suffered between 1776 and 1940 and by the earthquakes which struck in 1874, 1917 and 1976.

The city is also known for its solemn Holy Week processions, an annual tradition which began before the national capital was moved to Guatemala City.

Visitors to Antigua Guatemala can savour a variety of cuisines offered by the city's many restaurants, enjoy the atmosphere of its café-bars and nightclubs, and take part in any number of activities.

We recommend bringing sunscreen lotion, a hat, comfortable walking shoes such as sneakers, sandals, a swimsuit, light and airy clothing, and mosquito repellent.

18. Arrival at the airport and transport

Most international flights to Guatemala City land at La Aurora International Airport. The Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) of Guatemala will provide delegations with transport from La Aurora to Antigua Guatemala. We ask that flight itineraries be forwarded to the email addresses indicated in the paragraph below as soon as possible.

From Wednesday, 21 March to Friday 23 March 2018, the DGCA will also provide transport for approximately 30 people from their respective hotels to the seminar venue.
