ICAO Regional Seminar – EURNAT Regions Rotterdam, The Netherlands Thursday 13th and Friday 14th of April 2023

General Information

1. Place of venue and dates

The 2023 ICAO Regional Seminar in the EURNAT Region will take place in a monumental building called "Het Wereldmuseum" nicely located on the banks of the river De Maas (Meuse) right in the heart of the buzzling city of Rotterdam.

2. Meeting working hours

The meeting will run from 09:00 thought 17:00, with coffee and lunch breaks. Registration will open at 08:00 on the first day.

3. How to get there

Rotterdam is very easy to reach by public transport and has a direct connection to all major cities in the Netherlands (Amsterdam, The Hague and Utrecht) as well as a direct connection to Brussels.

<u>Flights:</u> most people flying in will use Schiphol Airport, but there are limited options to fly to Rotterdam/The Hague Airport. From there local public transport takes you into the city center.

<u>From Schiphol Airport to Rotterdam Central Station:</u> departure every 30 min without surcharge (50 min travel time), every 15 min with a surcharge of €2,90 (25 min travel time), all train leave from Platform 5-6.

<u>Train tickets:</u> can be purchased at the ticket machines at Schiphol Plaza, but the easiest way is to order a ticket via internet on <u>www.ns.nl.</u> Mind the surcharge for the fastest connection.

<u>From Brussels/Paris:</u> there is a direct connection to Rotterdam Central Station with Thalys service (tickets via <u>www.thalys.com</u>)

<u>From London (St-Pancras Station):</u> a direct connection takes you to Rotterdam Central Station in approximately 4 hours (<u>www.thetrainline.com</u>)

<u>From Frankfurt/Bonn/Cologne:</u> for anyone not arriving by air from Germany, but using rail taking the ICE, for Rotterdam Central you will have to change at Utrecht Central Station. Most fast trains to Rotterdam leave from Platform 8-9. For reservations see: https://www.bahn.com/p en/view/index.shtml

It is a very busy time in the Netherlands with Easter holidays and the start of the tourist season. Therefore, a block reservation has been made in hotels Inntel Hotels Rotterdam Centre (4-stars, 75 rooms), Mainport hotel (5-stars, 75 rooms) and Nhow Rotterdam (4 stars, 15 rooms)

Inntel Hotels and Mainport Hotel are both located nearby metro station Leuvehaven and at 10 minutes walking distance of the Wereldmuseum.



9. General information

a) City of Rotterdam

Rotterdam is a major European port and the second largest city of the Netherlands. The city lies along both banks of the New Meuse (Nieuwe Maas) River, which is a northern distributary of the Rhine River. The name Rotterdam was first mentioned in 1283, when a small tract of reclaimed land was created by draining the mouth of another river called the Rotte River that runs at the northwest side of the city.

Before World war II Rotterdam with canals and historical buildings resembled the current city centre of Amsterdam. After the bombing in May 1940 most of the city centre and part of the harbour was destroyed. After the war Rotterdam used this situation to resurrect as a modern city applying new architecture and laying out the first metro system in the Netherlands. The use of developments in architecture is still commonly applied in current projects.

The most important feature of Rotterdam is its harbour, Port of Rotterdam, responsible for most of the economic activities. Rotterdam forms a major gateway to the European inland connected to both the North Sea and important inland waterways. This geographical location made Rotterdam develop into a







crucial player in the European fuel market and a key part of the fuel infrastructure with large refinery installations and strategic oil storage capacity.

Although very different in character in comparison with Amsterdam, Rotterdam has become a modern lively city hosting many big events and offering the visitor many interesting places to visit as well as a wide international choice of restaurants. Due to its international character, Rotterdam nowadays has a population representing a very large number of different nationalities. Still, the mentality of 'the Rotterdammer' is generally described as tough, hard-working and never giving-up with a good sense of humour, which is well represented by the football club Feyenoord, the biggest and most famous of the city's three professional football teams playing in the first league. Other famous events are the annually organized Rotterdam Marathon in (15-16 April) and the North Sea Jazz festival (7-9 July 2023).

b) Climate

The climate conditions around this time of the year are variable and difficult to forecast. Usually the nights are still relatively cold (5°C), but during the day it can be sunny and more comfortable (11-13 °C) and in recent years we have experienced unusually high temperatures as well. Still rain is never far away.

d) Currency

The official currency of The Netherlands is the euro (€). For the daily exchange rates: http://www.xe.com/currencyconverter/nl/

International credit cards are accepted in many places (hotels and restaurants). In some smaller shops the use of credit cards may be limited. In a limited number of places, no coins or bills are accepted and card only payment applies.

e) Local transport

In the city of Rotterdam, all can be done by foot. Not only are the distances relatively small, also the center is pedestrian area and only accessible by car with a specific permit.

f) Banks and commercial schedule







The commercial schedule officially is from Monday to Friday 09:30 to 18:00. Sunday opening nowadays commonly is from 11:00 till 17:00. Most supermarkets are open until from 08:00 till 20:00 every weekday.

Service hours of banks are usually from 10:00 till 16:00 hrs.

ATMs are available 24/7 and can be found everywhere.

g) Taxes and gratuities

All purchases in the Netherlands include tax (21%). International travelers may recover the tax paid, but you will need to ask for it at the airport.

In most cases service is included. However, to tip in taxis and restaurants is not uncommon, in case you are very happy with the service. Formally a minimum nor a maximum exists, but about 10% of the total sum is commonly applied.

10. Health Coverage

The health care system in The Netherlands is considered to be good, but it is always better not to test it. Participants shall have medical insurance or other type of medical coverage in case of illness or medical emergency. None of the organizations (Government, place of venue) involved in the hosting of this event will take any responsibility for medical expenses incurred by a participant.

11. Electricity

Power is 220-230V /50Hz. Most used plug type:







12. Airport taxes

The Netherlands currently does not apply additional departure taxes to be paid on top of your ticket.

13. Passport and visa requirements



TRAVEL Information

Travel information Regional Seminar in Rotterdam arriving by AIR

Arriving at Schiphol may give some confusion, despite the quite accurate indications/signs/etc.

• Leaving the baggage claim area you will somehow reach an area called Plaza by following the signs, Schiphol Plaza. For further information:

- In Schiphol Plaza you will have access to the railway platforms below.
- To obtain a ticket (if you have not booked a ticket on the internet already), there are yellow ticket machines around, but they take only bank cards.

• Train:

- for those staying in <u>Amsterdam</u>: look for a train to Amsterdam Centraal, some of the indicators state Amsterdam, but there are various stations.
- o For those going to Rotterdam: see above.
- <u>Taxi's</u>: taxi's are expensive. DO NOT accept any offers made by people approaching you in the main hall (Plaza), they are usually not trustworthy etc.
- <u>Disturbances in public transport</u>: in case of sudden delays or interruptions, alternative transport (buses) will be offered to Amsterdam and Rotterdam main station. Be alert on the announcements.

Travel information for Rotterdam city

After arriving at Rotterdam Central Station (see instructions in the main document):

- o Go to the exit at side of the city centre
- Access to the Metro lines can be found straight ahead of the control gates
- o Access to the Tramway lines can be found on the left hand side

The venue can be reached by <u>Metro lines D/E</u> (direction Slinge/De Akkers), every 6 min, duration 4 min, get off at stop Leuvehaven, 9 minutes' walk to Wereldmuseum







The venue can be reached by $\underline{\text{Tram line 7}}$ (direction Willemsplein) every 20 min, duration 11 min, get off at stop Stadscentrum/Willemskade, 2 minutes' walk to Wereldmuseum
