Mr. Foo is currently the Advisor for Aviation Safety at the Permanent Mission of Singapore to ICAO. In this capacity, he supports Singapore's efforts towards the development of aviation safety globally. Prior to his current appointment, he held concurrent appointments as Director (Safety Policy and Licensing) and Director (Aerodrome and ANS Regulation) in the Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore (CAAS).

Mr. Foo joined the CAAS in 1998. He oversaw the development of Singapore's approach on Safety Management Systems for air operators and maintenance organizations and started the implementation of the State Safety Programme. In his previous appointment, he was responsible for safety-related policies, as well as the oversight of personnel licensing, aerodromes and air navigation services. He also carried out safety oversight of CAAS-approved maintenance organisations and the airworthiness aspects of Singapore air operators, in particular the B777 and A320 fleets, earlier in his career.

Mr. Foo was deeply involved in both the 2000 ICAO audit and the 2010 USOAP CSA audit of Singapore. He chaired the ICAO Group of Experts for the USOAP CMA Structured Review (GE USR) and is a member of the Safety Management Panel, the Global Aviation Safety Plan (GASP) Study Group, and the Global Aviation Safety Oversight System (GASOS) Study Group.

Mr. Foo holds a Master of Science in Human Factors and Safety Assessment in Aeronautics from Cranfield University, UK, and a Bachelor of Engineering in Electrical and Electronics Engineering from Nanyang Technological University, Singapore.
