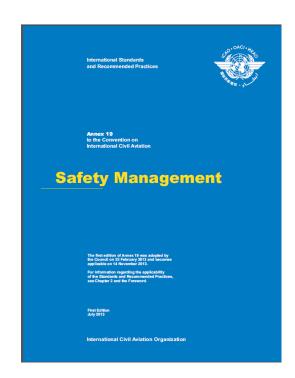

ICAO Annex 19 – Safety Management

Are Annex 19 provisions designed to protect safety data and information?

- Develop advance arrangements to promote cooperation between countries, relevant civil aviation authorities, and aviation organizations.
- Defining terms such as "inappropriate use,"
 "reckless conduct," "gross negligence," and
 "willful misconduct" will always be a challenge
 to address for different legal systems and cultures.



ICAO Annex 19 – Safety Management (Cont'd)

- 3. The **balancing test** that takes into account the interests of aviation safety and the need for the appropriate administration of justice remains unclear for many jurisdictions.
- 4. The need, and guidance for, training of judicial stakeholders should be clearly laid out.
- Protecting safety information in the context of Freedom of Informationtype laws.





ICAO Annex 19 – Safety Management (Cont'd)

What more should be done at ICAO, State and service provider levels?

- At ICAO level:
 - Need ICAO audit of SIP implementation at the State and organization levels
- At the State level (SSP):
 - Implementation of training courses for aviation and judicial stakeholders.
- At the organization level (SMS):
 - Cross-border implementation of SIP at the regional level.
- Develop ready-to-use toolkits
