**Expedite border clearance process**

## Main challenge for Facilitation



**100,000 daily flights**

**More than 3.5 annual Million International passengers per year  
for whom border clearance need to be expedited**

**Minimum of 10 seconds are needed by the first line Officer for each pax clearance**



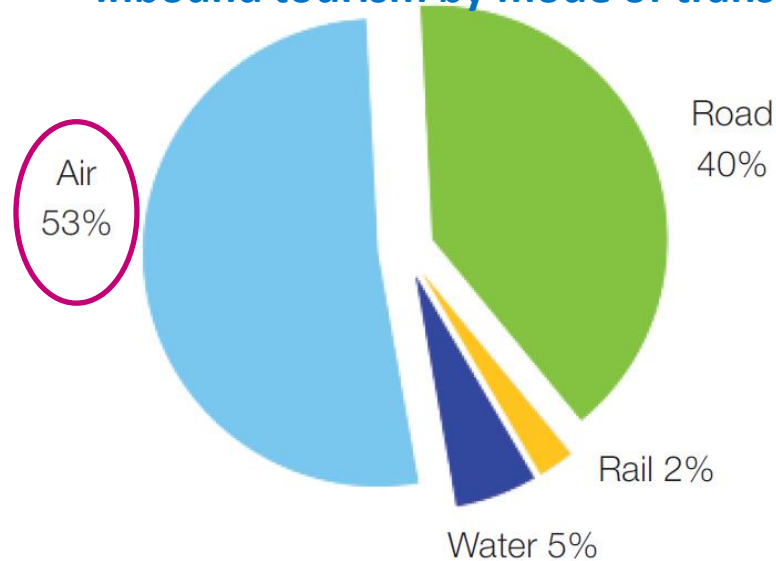
**Substantial lack of resources to expedite clearance for all pax**

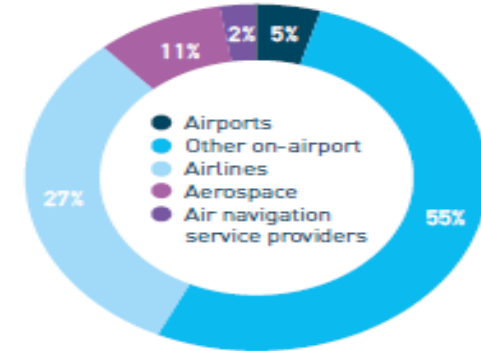

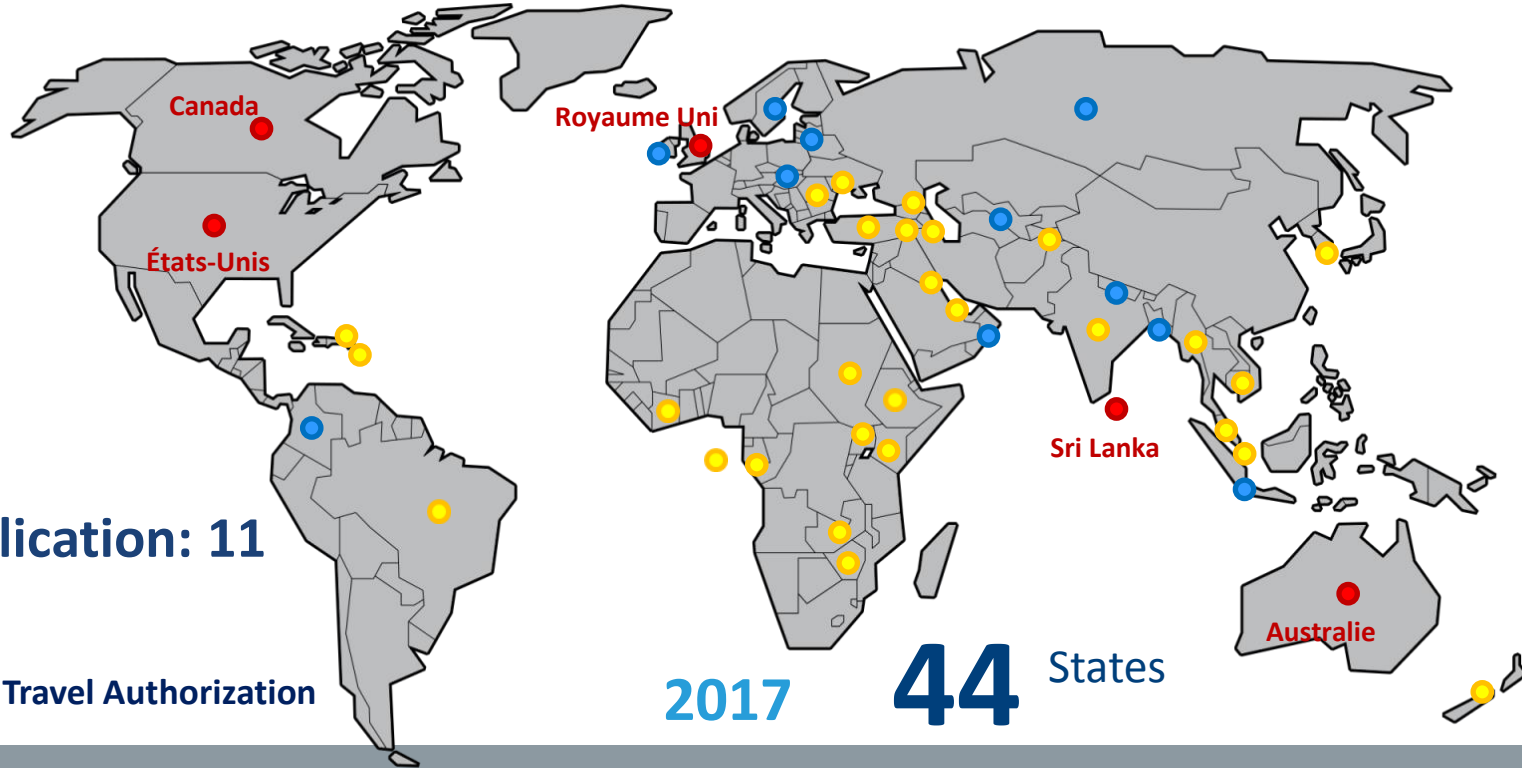

# ICAO and the United Nations Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy



- Counter-Terrorism Implementation Task Force (CTITF) established by the UN Secretary-General in 2005.
- Mandate: strengthen coordination and coherence of counter-terrorism efforts of the UN system to avoid duplication of efforts, and improve accountability.
- CTITF consists of 38 international entities including CTED and ICAO, each of them contributing to the multilateral counter-terrorism efforts consistently with its own mandate.



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## UNSC resolutions 2178 (2014) and 2309 (2016)...

## ...reaffirmed in UNSC resolutions 2368 (2017)

- “Reaffirms that all States shall prevent the movement of terrorists or terrorist groups by effective border controls and controls on issuance of identity papers and travel documents, and through measures for preventing counterfeiting, forgery or fraudulent use of identity papers and travel documents...”
- “9. *Calls upon* Member States to require that airlines operating in their territories **provide advance passenger information (API)** to the appropriate national authorities in order to detect the departure from their territories, or attempted entry into or transit through their territories, by means of civil aircraft, of individuals designated by the Committee established pursuant to resolutions 1267 (1999) and 1989 (2011)...”
- “*Noting* that **Annex 9 —Facilitation** to the Convention on International Civil Aviation, done at Chicago on December 7, 1944 (the “Chicago Convention”) contains **standards and recommended practices** relevant to the **detection and prevention of terrorist threats involving civil aviation** ”
- “*Further calls upon* all States to require that **airlines operating in their territories provide advance passenger information** to the appropriate national authorities in order to detect the departure from their territories, or attempted entry into or transit through their territories, by means of civil aircraft, of individuals designated by the Committee pursuant to resolutions 1267 (1999), 1989 (2011) and 2253 (2015);”

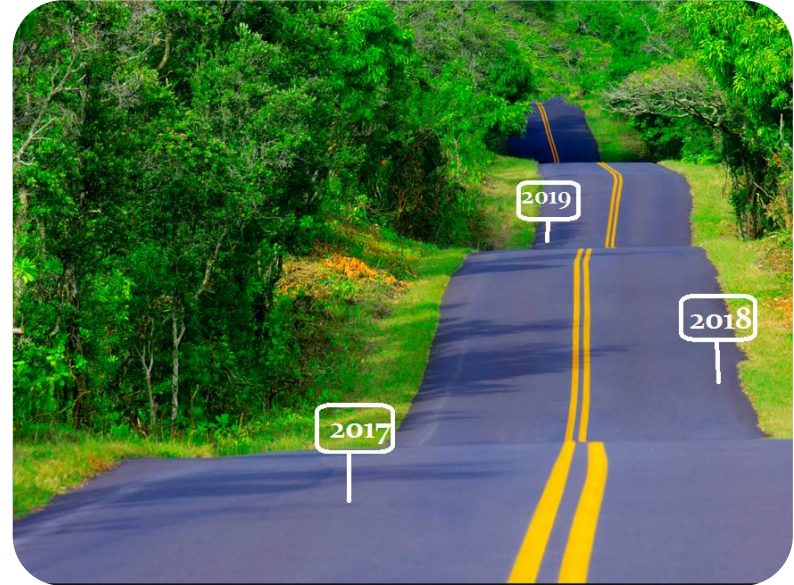


## Overview of the ICAO TRIP Roadmap

- In the international context, the aim is to systematically collaborate with all interested stakeholders to implement each element of the TRIP Strategy.



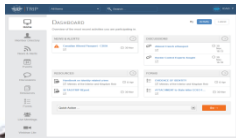

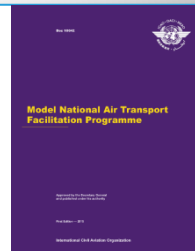

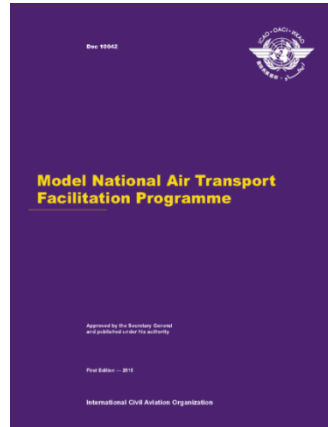

Reason: ► Means of coordinating activities between departments or agencies of the State concerned with or responsible for various aspects of facilitation of national civil aviation ◀



Mandate: Stds 8.17 & 8.19 and A39-20 Appendix C: National cooperation on facilitation matters

- improve the effectiveness and efficiency of clearance control formalities
- establish national FAL committees
- national regulations & practices conform to Annex 9 SARPs
- solve day-to-day FAL problems
- study FAL problems & coordinate with other States

## 9.1 Programme and Coordination

- **44% of audited States** have not established a National Air Transport Facilitation Programme based on the facilitation requirements of Annex 9.
- **49% of the audits** reveal States have not established a National Air Transport Facilitation Committee and/or Airport Facilitation Committees, or similar coordinating bodies.



## 9.2 Security of Travel Documents


- Over **95%** of audited States are issuing MRPs in accordance with DOC 9303.
- Over **90%** of audited States :
  - incorporate security features in current travel documents;
  - have safeguards against theft of blank travel documents; and
  - establish appropriate controls over the entire travel document application, adjudication and issuance processes.

**3.11.1 For passports issued after 24 November 2005 and which are not machine readable, Contracting States shall ensure the expiration date falls before 24 November 2015.**





# ePassport: Current status

## Member States issuing ePassports

Asia and Pacific (APAC) :17 out of 38

Eastern and Southern African Office (ESAF) : 8 out of 24

European and North Atlantic (EUR/NAT) : 53 out of 56

Middle East (MID) : 7 out of 15

North American, Central American and Caribbean (NACC) : 4 out of 21

South American (SAM) : 7 out of 13

Western and Central African (WACAF) : 15 out of 24

Total: 111 + 12 other entities

- More than **110 countries** issuing chip-based passports
- Over **700 million ePassports** in circulation
- 24 November 2015 deadline for non-MRPs is of current concern for some States
- The inspection of these documents lags far behind the issuance programs

**Issuance of ePassport is not an Annex 9 Standard**



## 9.2 Security of Travel Documents

**State's policies and processes to report information about stolen, lost, and revoked travel documents, issued by the State, to INTERPOL**

- Approximately **80% of States audited** have:
  - established a policy to report to INTERPOL;
  - designated an office or entity as responsible for reporting information;
  - developed guidelines for reporting information.
- Over **80% States audited** have reported stolen, lost, and revoked travel documents to INTERPOL for inclusion in the SLTD database.



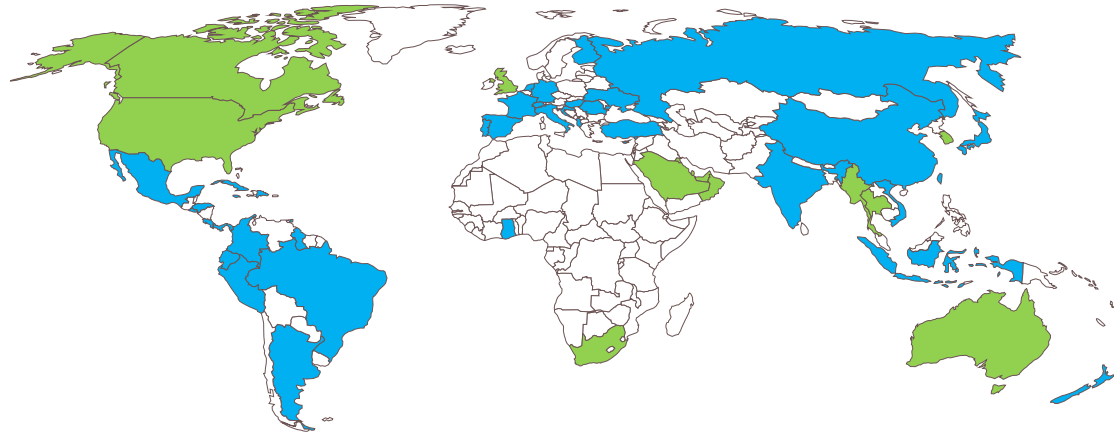
## 9.3 Inspection of Travel Documents

- Over **90% of audited States** require appropriate measures and procedures to be established to assist aircraft operators in the evaluation of travel documents presented by passengers in order to detect fraud and abuse
- Only **68% of audited States** ensure this requirement is implemented.
- Necessary precautions are taken by aircraft operators at the point of embarkation in **70% of audited States** to ensure that persons are in possession of the documents prescribed by the States of transit and destination.
- Over **75% of audited States** are also ensuring that fraudulent, falsified or counterfeit travel documents are removed from circulation immediately and returned to the appropriate authorities of the State named as issuer.



## 9.4 Entry Procedures and Responsibilities

- Approximately 60% of audited States have not introduced an Advance Passenger Information (API) system under their national legislation

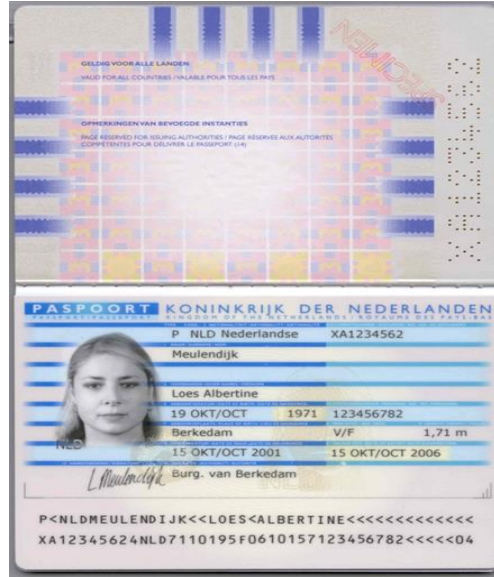
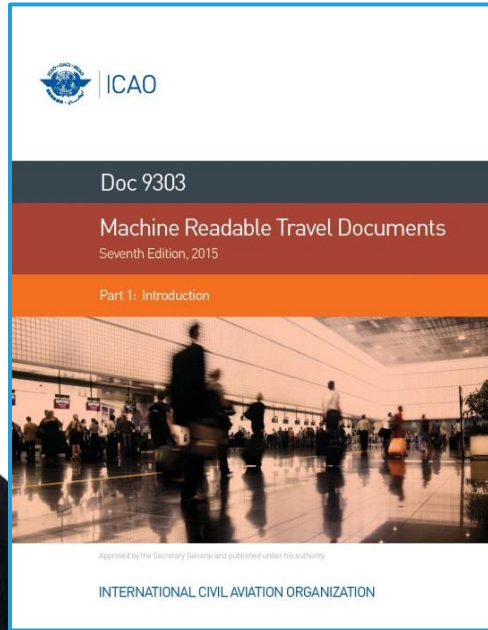

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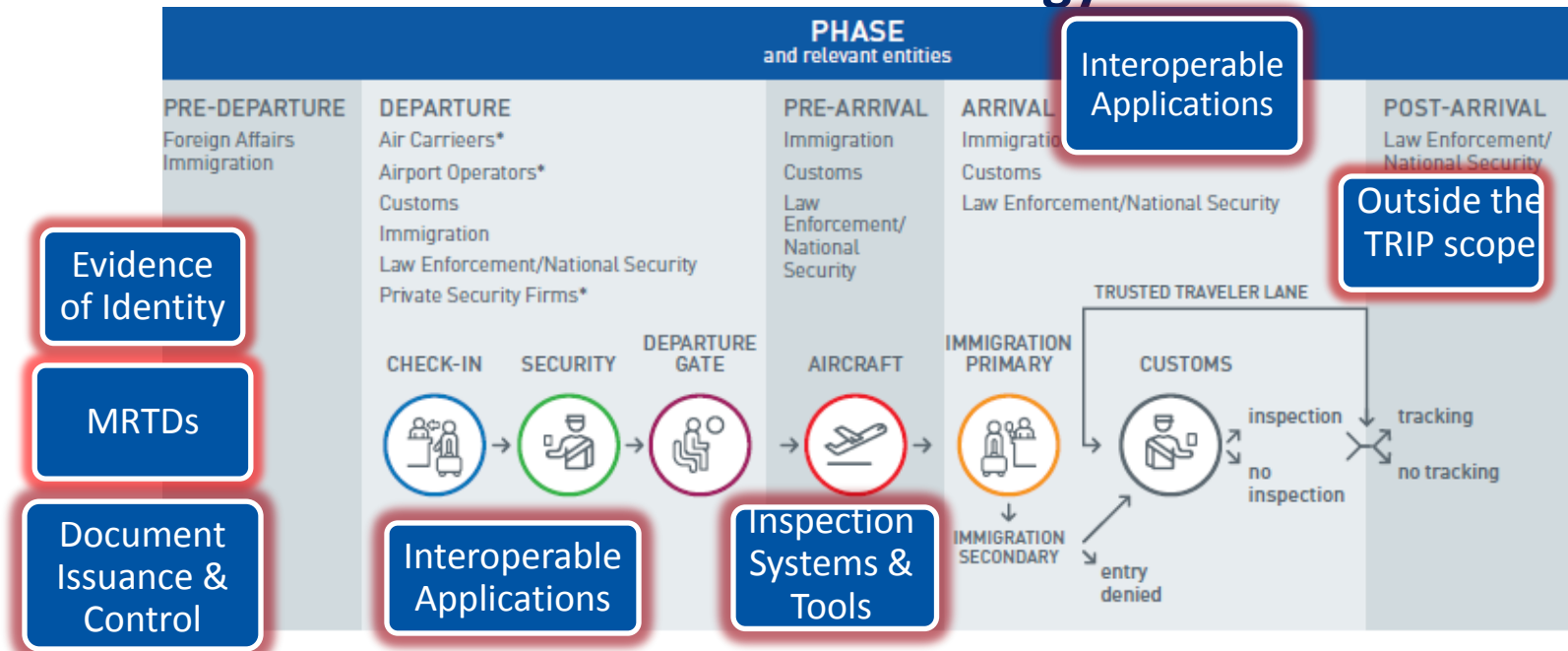
