






Expedite border clearance

Minimum of 10 seconds are needed by the fist line Officer for each pax clearance

Substantial lack of resources to expedite clearance for all pax




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More than half of International tourists arrive by air

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



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Uniting Travel Statement on Facilitation

WE CALL FOR:

- a) Policies which facilitate international Travel & Tourism and thus export growth which generate economic and social benefits globally.
- b) The expansion of transparent visa processes, visa waiver programmes, regional visa agreements and trusted traveller programmes, as well as seamless travel procedures at borders.
- c) The use of new technologies to make travel more accessible, convenient, and more efficient while enhancing security.





















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
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Role of visa facilitation in air transport growth



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ICAO and the United Nations Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy



- Counter-Terrorism Implementation Task Force (CTITF) established by the UN Secretary-General in 2005.
- Mandate: strengthen coordination and coherence of counter-terrorism efforts of the UN) system to avoid duplication of efforts, and improve accountability.
- CTITF consists of 38 international entities including CTED and ICAO, each of them contributing to the multilateral counter-terrorism efforts consistently with its own mandate.



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...reaffirmed in UNSC resolutions 2368 (2017)
"Reaffirms that all States shall prevent the movement of terrorists or terrorist groups by effective border controls and controls on issuance of identity papers and travel documents, and through measures for preventing counterfeiting, forgery or fraudulent use of identity papers and travel documents..."

Calls upon Member States to require that airlines operating in their territories provide advance passenger information (API) to the appropriate national authorities in order to detect the departure from their territories, or attempted entry into or transit through their territories, by means of civil aircraft, of individuals designated by the Committee established pursuant to resolutions 1267 (1999) and 1989 (2011)..."

"Noting that Annex 9 —Facilitation to the Convention on International Civil Aviation, done at Chicago on December 7, 1944 (the "Chicago Convention") contains standards and recommended practices relevant to the detection and prevention of terrorist threats involving civil aviation "

"Further calls upon all States to require that airlines operating in their territories provide advance passenger information to the appropriate national authorities in order to detect the departure from their territories, or attempted entry into or transit through their territories, by means of civil aircraft, of individuals designated by the Committee pursuant to resolutions 1267 (1999), 1989 (2011) and 2253 (2015):"

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



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Overview of the ICAO TRIP Roadmap

- ICAO TRIP roadmap aims to provide target milestones for the implementation by States of each element of the ICAO TRIP Strategy.
- At the national level, coordinated action would be required between many government and industry entities:

<u>Preliminary step:</u> Establish a National Air Transport Facilitation Programme and Committees

 In the international context, the aim is to systematically collaborate with all interested stakeholders to implement each element of the TRIP Strategy.



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Section 1980

9.1 Programme and Coordination

- 44% of audited States have not established a National Air Transport Facilitation Programme based on the facilitation requirements of Annex 9.
- 49% of the audits reveal States have not established a National Air Transport Facilitation Committee and/or Airport Facilitation Committees, or similar coordinating bodies.



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- Over 95% of audited States are issuing MRPs in accordance with DOC 9303.
- Over 90% of audited States :
 - incorporate security features in current travel documents;
 - have safeguards against theft of blank travel documents; and
 - rightarrow establish appropriate controls over the entire travel document application, adjudication and issuance processes.

3.11.1 For passports issued after 24 November 2005 and which are not machine readable, Contracting States shall ensure the expiration date falls before 24 November 2015.

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ePassport: Current status

Member States issuing ePassports

Asia and Pacific (APAC) :17 out of 38

Eastern and Southern African Office (ESAF): 8 out of 24

European and North Atlantic (EUR/NAT): 53 out of 56

- More than 110 countries issuing chip-based passports
- Over 700 million ePassports in circulation
- 24 November 2015 deadline for non-MRPs is of current concern for some States
- The inspection of these documents lags far behind the issuance programs

Issuance of ePassport is not an Annex 9 Standard



9.2 Security of Travel Documents

State's policies and processes to report information about stolen, lost, and revoked travel documents, issued by the State, to INTERPOL

- Approximately 80% of States audited have:
 - established a policy to report to INTERPOL;
 - designated an office or entity as responsible for reporting information;
 - developed guidelines for reporting information.
- Over 80% States audited have reported stolen, lost, and revoked travel documents to INTERPOL for inclusion in the SLTD database.



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9.3 Inspection of Travel Documents

- Over 90% of audited States require appropriate measures and procedures to be established to assist aircraft operators in the evaluation of travel documents presented by passengers in order to detect fraud and abuse
- Only 68% of audited States ensure this requirement is implemented.
- Necessary precautions are taken by aircraft operators at the point of embarkation in 70% of audited States to ensure that persons are in possession of the documents prescribed by the States of transit and destination.
- Over 75% of audited States are also ensuring that fraudulent, falsified or counterfeit travel documents are removed from circulation immediately and returned to the appropriate authorities of the State named as issuer.




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


9.4 Entry Procedures and Responsibilities

 Approximately 60% of audited States have not introduced an Advance Passenger Information (API) system under their national legislation
