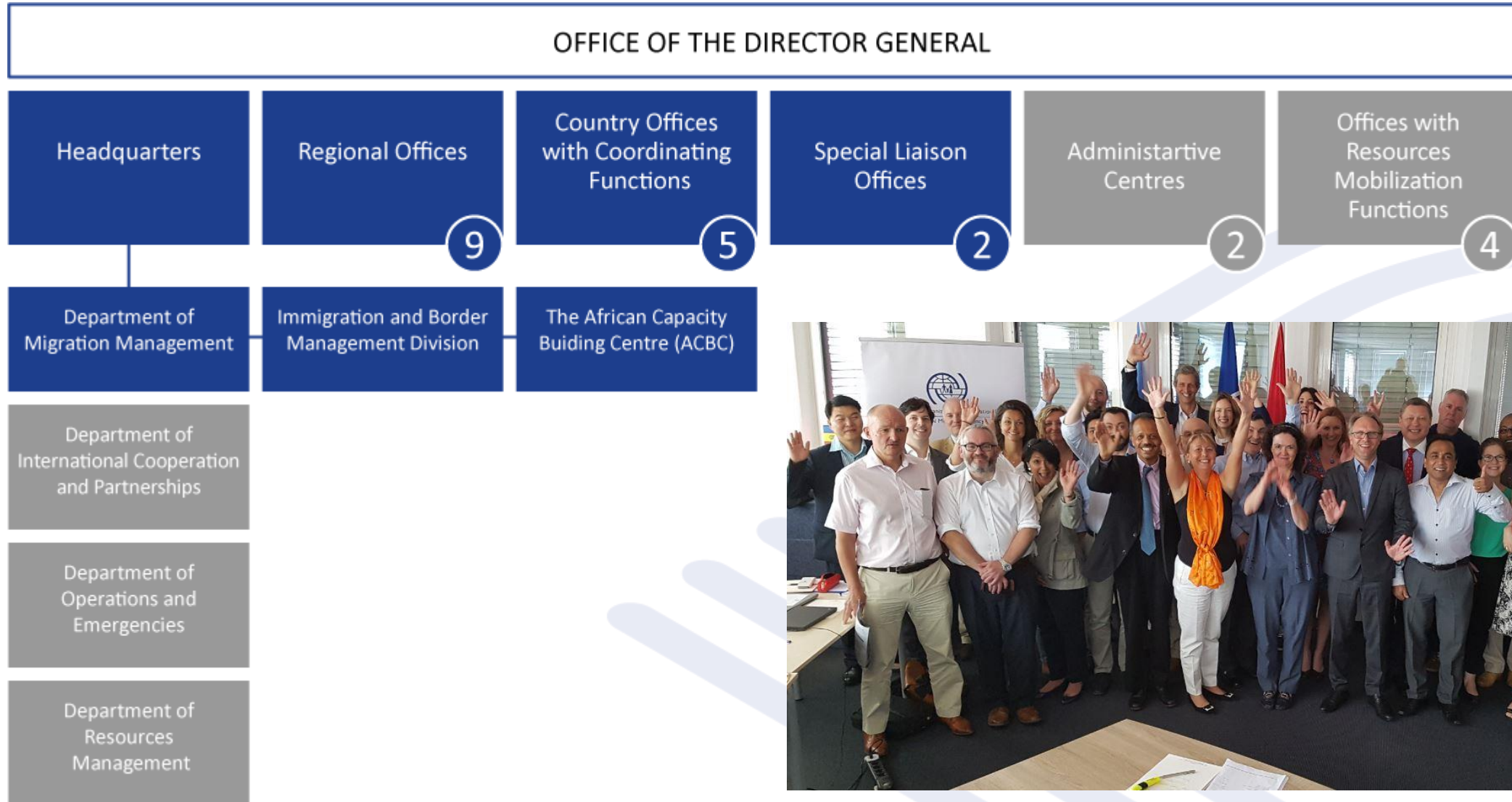

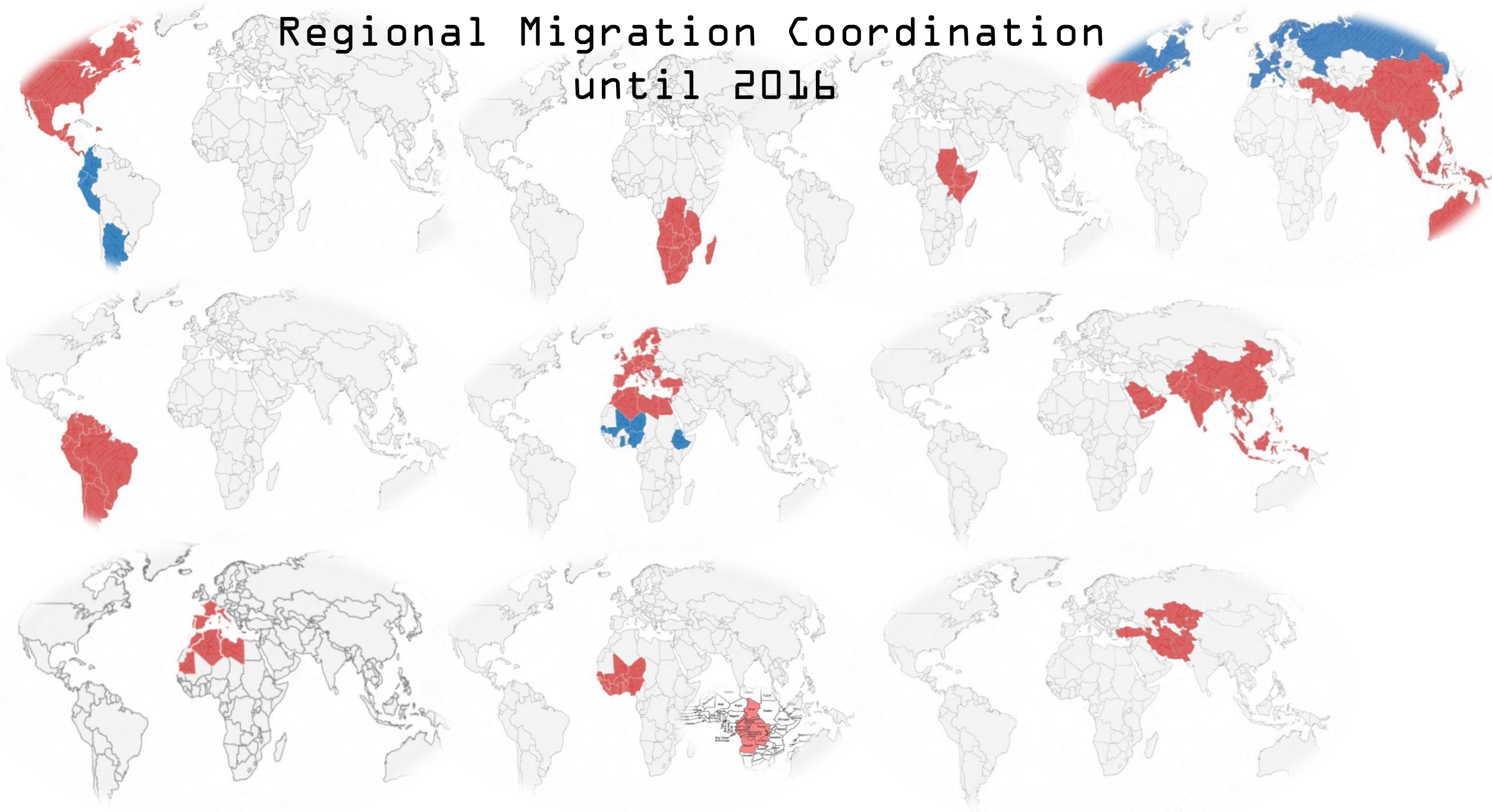

1. Driving Forces:

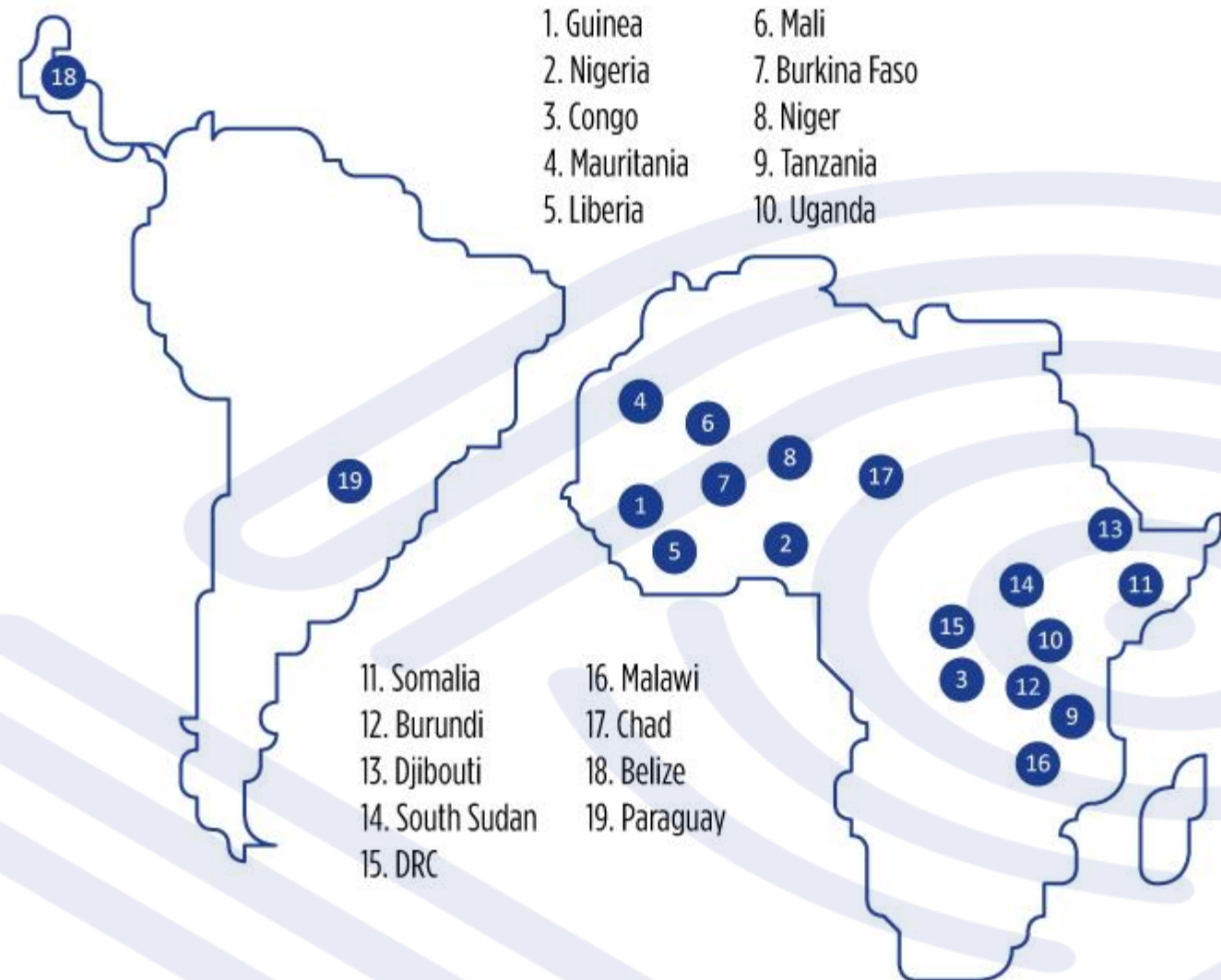
- a. Millions of border crossings per year.

- b. System Developers

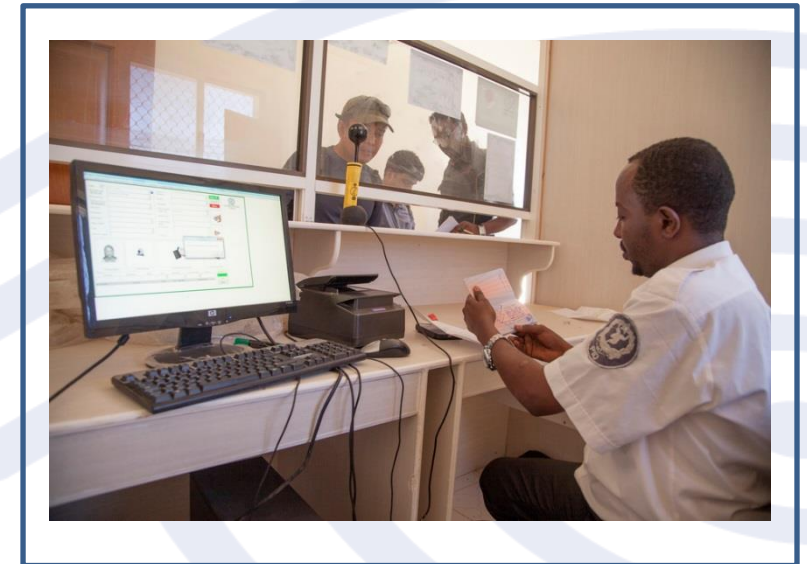
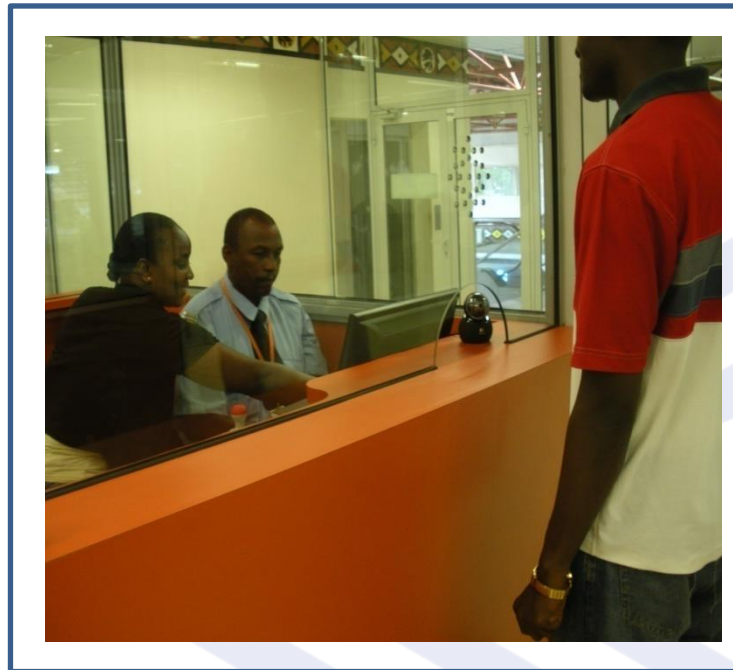
IOM in-house developed Border Management Information System:

- VII. Operational in **19 countries** (Africa, South and Central America), 125 border crossing points (land, air or sea).

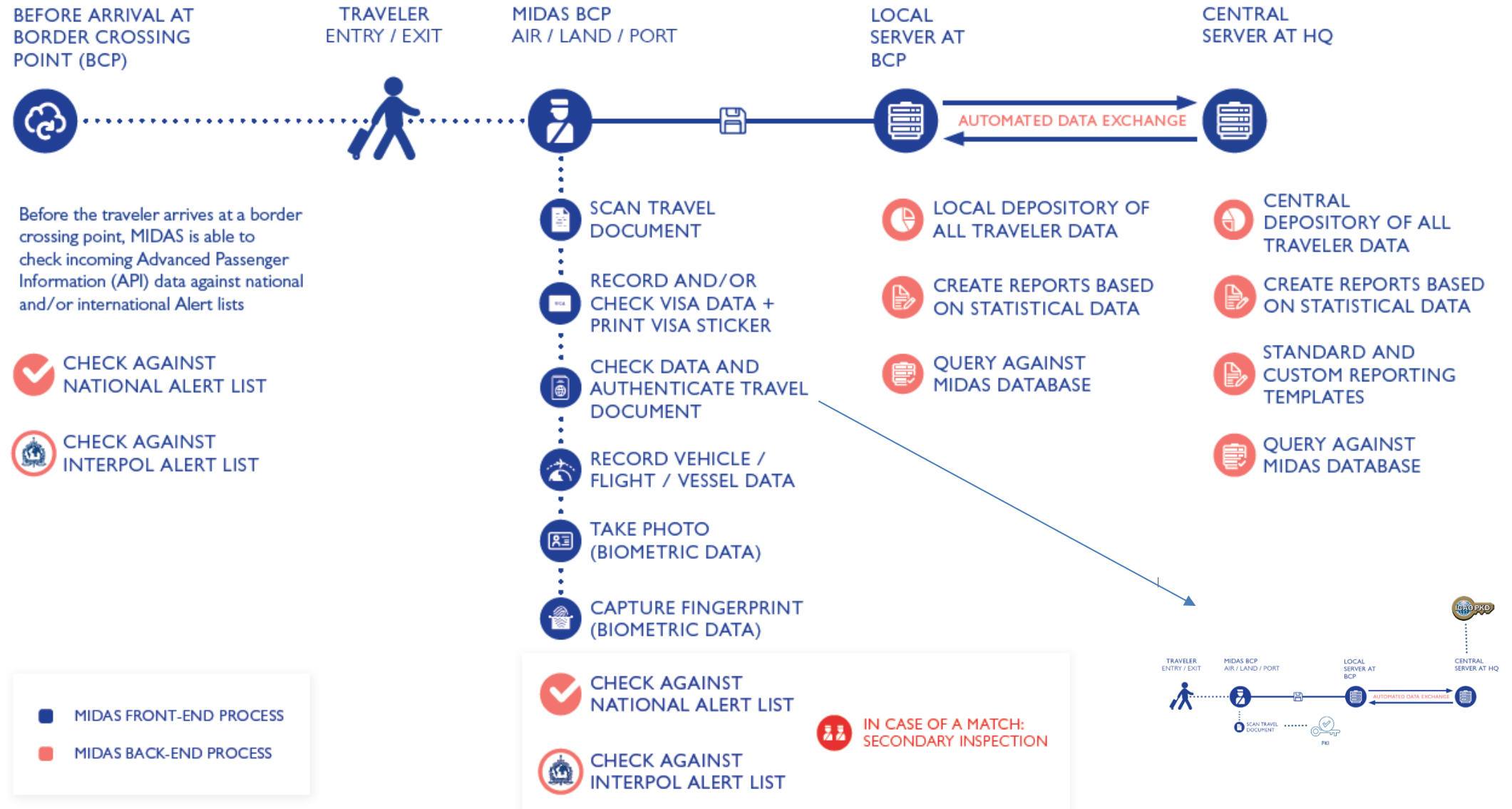


A standard MIDAS workstation consists of:

Example of MIDAS installation: Belize

- Donor paid.
- 5 BCPs installed in 2012.
- Connected to INTERPOL (MIND).
- 80 Immigration Officers Trained
- September 2017: 10.5 million travelers inspected and processed by MIDAS since its implementation.
- Government requested and received:
 - a. Temporary travel card.
 - b. Interface for residence permit and visa extensions.
 - c. Generating list of over-stayers.
 - d. Verification against the national ID Card database

- Access to source code granted
- 2 BCPs installed in 2016.
- Connected to INTERPOL (MIND).
- Government requested:
 - a. Entry ticket.
 - b. Penalty ticket.
