# What are travel documents for refugees and stateless persons?





1951 Refugee Convention, Article

"The Contracting States shall issue to refugees lawfully staying in their territory travel documents for the purpose of travel outside their







## Why are such travel documents needed?

- Refugees and stateless persons <u>rely on their host</u>
   <u>State</u> for travel documents
- Refugees have a well-founded fear of persecution in their country of origin and can therefore normally not seek a national passport without putting themselves at risk of harm
- Stateless persons are persons who are not considered as nationals by any State and therefore have no State to turn to for a national passport











#### What are such documents used for?

- Supports <u>safe and regular movement</u> and reduces the risks of travel through dangerous sea and land journeys
- Strengthens <u>self-reliance and resilience</u>, the ability of refugees and stateless persons to lead more independent and stable lives

#### A few examples:

- education
- work abroad
- family visits or reunification medical evacuations
- humanitarian admissions
- private sponsorships
- resettlement





## What are the applicable standards?

- Machine-readability (as national passports)
- Joint guidance issued by UNHCR and ICAO (February 2017)

Annex 9, Standard 3.12:

"Contracting States shall ensure that travel documents for refugees and stateless persons ("Convention Travel Documents") are <u>machine</u> <u>readable</u>, in accordance with the specifications of Doc 9303."










### How is this implemented in practice?



➤ An estimated 20% of the world's refugees (3.2 mill) have access to travel documents issued in line with international standards

UNHCR provides
"CTD booklets" to
19% of the world's
refugees
(in 29 States)


➤ 41% of refugees (6.9 million refugees) do not have access to travel document of any kind from their host State







- Seen a steady increase over the last 8 years
- > Still a long way to go to reach global compliance in line with national passports









## The way forward:

- States which are <u>not yet</u> issuing machinereadable convention travel documents to refugees and stateless persons are encouraged to do so (Standard 3.12)
- UNHCR will continue to work with States to promote the introduction of MRCTDs, including through the provision of (start up) material support and technical support and guidance in cooperation with ICAO

#### **Good practice for States:**

Integrate travel documents of refugees and stateless persons into the tendering and procurement process for national passports
