### **ICRC Emergency Travel Document**

- Issued to asylum seekers, refugees, migrants in particularly vulnerable situations, displaced
  people or stateless people, all of whom do not possess a passport or other recognized
  travel document and find themselves unable to return to their country of origin or
  residence, or to proceed to a country offering temporary or permanent refuge or asylum
- Issued as a last resort, when authorities are not in a position to provide a document and holder has the necessary visas and meets travel requirements



### **ICRC Emergency Travel Document**

- To facilitate the repatriation of former detainees and other individuals or their return to their country of habitual residence
- To facilitate family reunification, in particular for children and other vulnerable individuals, who have been separated by armed conflicts and other violence
- Valid only for a one-way journey and issued free of charge exclusively by ICRC delegates



## **Legal Basis**

#### **LEGAL BASIS**

The legal basis for the ICRC emergency travel document is the ICRC's recognized universal right of humanitarian initiative, as set out in:

- Ārticles 9/9/9/10 common to the Geneva Conventions of 12 August 1949
- Article 81(1) of Additional Protocol I of 8 June 1977
- Article 3 common to the Geneva Conventions
- Article 5(3) of the Statutes of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement, adopted by the States party to the Geneva Conventions.

When, as frequently happens, the emergency travel document is used to reunite families, the legal basis is also set out in:

- Article 26 of the Fourth Geneva Convention
- . Article 74 of Additional Protocol I.


These articles stipulate that the parties to a conflict and the high contracting parties to the Geneva Conventions must facilitate the reunification of families dispersed as a result of armed conflicts, and encourage the work of humanitarian organizations engaged in this task.

## Compliance with ICAO standards

- ICRC worked closely with ICAO New Technologies Working Group, who established the ICAO Guidance on Emergency Travel Documents
- Explicit mention of ICRC Emergency Travel Documents in ICAO Guidance on Emergency Travel Documents
- Review and upgrade of ICRC Emergency Travel Documents



## ICRC strengths

- Presence in more than 80 countries affected by conflicts, violence and emergency situations
- Field proximity with affected population
- Rigorous process of enrolment, issuance and data management (unique centralized database)
- Close collaboration with Embassies, Consulates, UNHCR and IOM





#### ICRC challenges

- Low volume of documents issued
- Inconsistent infrastructure in challenging environments
- Keep capacity to issue documents in each ICRC country office (80)
- Keep capacity to issue documents rapidly in emergency situations




