

Boubacar Djibo was appointed Director of the Air Transport Bureau of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) in November 2011. He is responsible for the management of programmes to achieve three of ICAO's five strategic objectives: security and facilitation, economic development of air transport and environmental protection. Before joining ICAO, Mr. Djibo was Secretary General of the African Civil Aviation Commission (AFCAC). While there, he worked on

key initiatives in the areas of regional coordination for the implementation of the ICAO Standards and Recommended Practices relating to safety and security; the implementation of the Yamoussoukro Decision for the liberalization of air services; and training and capacity building with the African Union, African regional economic communities, ICAO, International Air Transport Association (IATA), Airports Council International (ACI) and African Airlines Association (AFRAA). Throughout an aviation career beginning in 1984, he occupied key positions including Director of Civil Aviation of Niger and ICAO Project Coordinator. He also served on the Board of Directors of Air Afrique and the Agency for Aerial Navigation Safety in Africa and Madagascar (ASECNA).
