- Technical support and deployment of 'goTravel'






12 countries have received assessments since Programme launch


12 roadmaps, and **1** regional workplan with CARICOM, developed since Programme launch

15 countries (through CARICOM IMPACS) testing goTravel software


At least **8** upcoming assessments for 2021 including Mongolia, Morocco, Iraq, DRC, South Africa
