


The existing trend towards **modernization and digitalization** needs to accelerate, particularly when it comes to **border technologies**




Base-level **cooperation** between **border authorities** and **health services** must improve

Equitable and Predictable human mobility shall be integrated into **pandemic preparedness, health emergency response and inclusive recovery**




World recovery leaves behind **less developed countries** and further risks stalling socioeconomic development;

Out of 180 countries, 93% reported that migrants in regular situations had access to COVID-19 vaccines, and only 56% for migrants in irregular situations.
